THE SHIPPING OF LIQUOR

THE ONTARIO LICENSE BOARD SENDS OUT ADVICE.

Orders Must Be in the Hands of the Shippers by Midnight on March 30th—The Time For Delivery.

License Inspector William McCammon has been advised by the Ontario License Board, regarding the shipments of liquor.

Referring to the Order-in-Council passed at Ottawa, governing the delivery of liquor for beverages, taking effect about the 1st of April, Clause 4 of the Order-in-Council passed March 11th, reads as follows:

No person after the first day of April shall send, take, transport into, or deliver in any prohibited area, any intoxicating liquor, or cause any intoxicating liquor to be sent, transported or delivered.

The board interprets this to mean that no intoxicating liquor for beverage purposes can be delivered after midnight, Monday, April 1st, to the consumer. In the opinion of the board, this clause will still apply where breweries and distilleries are located, and are making direct delivery from the brewery or distillery without using the railway or express companies.

On March 22nd a regulation was passed which provided that any intoxicating liquor actually shipped before April 1st, may be delivered in such prohibited area by a common carrier within such period as is required for such delivery under the ordinary and usual conditions governing the business of such common carrier, but not later than May 1st.

The board interprets this to mean that where shipments are made to Ontario, either from outside the province or from one point in Ontario to another point in Ontario, where transportation is used by the railway or express companies, such shipments under this clause must be actually in the hands of the said companies for shipment, not later than midnight March 30th, otherwise shipments would be illegal. However, in such case should any delay occur while shipment is being made, the actual delivery will be legal any date till May 1st.

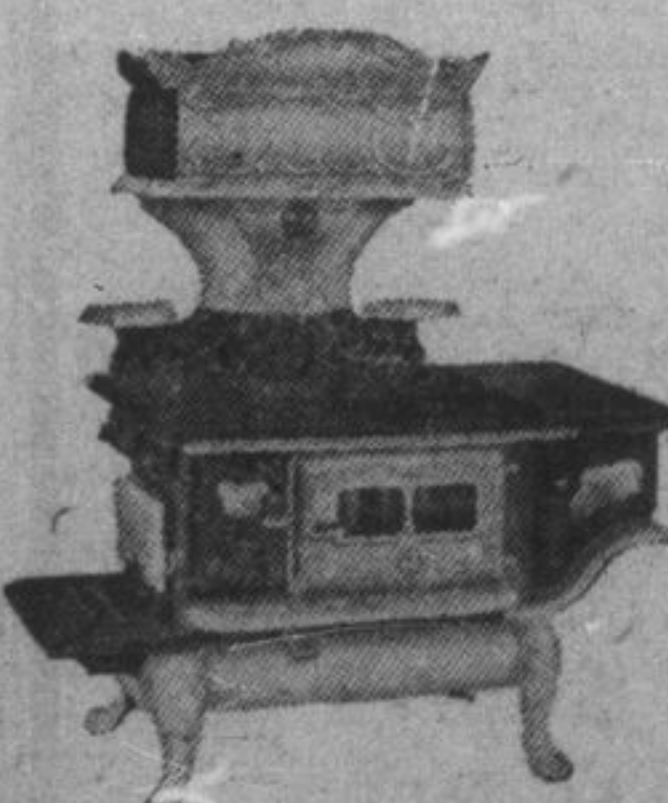

TO START TREE CUTTING

CITY ENGINEER GIVEN AUTHORITY TO HAVE WORK BEGUN.

Park Avenue to Be First Attacked—Application to Install Gasoline Tanks Refused.

At the Board of Works meeting on Wednesday evening the city engineer was given authority to engage a man at thirty-five cents an hour to cut down trees in the parks and streets in connection with the Board's scheme to furnish 1,000 cords of wood for fuel next winter. The engineer intends to start this work next Monday on Park avenue.

The requests of the Canada Oil Company and Robinson and Wiltshire to install gasoline tanks in front of their places of business were refused, as the city engineer reported it would be contrary to the by-laws to give them the privilege.

The engineer was authorized to call for tenders for street watering. In attendance were Alds. O'Connor (chairman), Couper, Litton, Black, J. W. Smith and Simmons.
