

There is reason to believe that fifty German divisions capproximately 650,000 men) are following into the struggle and probably half as many more (approximately 325,000) are in close reserve. The British War Office states that the British are falling back in good order across a devastated area to previously prepared positions.. With very heavy fighting in progress on the whole front and with fresh German forces in action, the British troops on the northern front of the battlefield are holding their positions.
