Military News

It will be of interest to friends in Kingston and Queen's University of Capt. A. M. Warner, R.A.M.C., to learn that he has been mentioned in General Van Deyn's despatches from East Africa for meritorious service in the field. After the capture of Dar Es Salaam, capital of German East Africa, Capt. Warner was given command of the Base Carrier Hospital, which he built and organized into a 1,200 bed hospital. Later he was sent to organize a similar one at Lindi, near the Portuguese East border. Capt. Warner is a graduate of Queen's University, arts '10, medicine '12, and a son-in-law of Mrs. F. Peart Birley, 227 Albert street, city.

The formation of a Canadian Tank Battalion is authorized, to consist of 80 officers and 700 men, and it is hoped to recruit it by volunteering and send it overseas not later than May 1st. Preference will be given to returned officers, if suitable and fit, and to officers who have served in Canada on staffs or in units and have as yet no opportunity of proceeding overseas. — Capt. R. L. Denison, late of the 8th Battalion, C.E.F., and lately commanding the machine-gun corps in Canada, has been selected to command the new unit.

The military authorities have ruled that a man applying for leave of absence before the Leave of Absence Board cannot be represented by counsel. In cases connected with agriculture, the district agricultural representative will be consulted but counsel will not be heard.
