The Theatres

"Gus Hill's Big Minstrels."

The many lovers of minstrelsy will be delighted to learn that Gus Hill's "Big Minstrels" will be the attraction at the Grand Wednesday, April 10th, matinee and night. Seventy years ago Dan Emmett, author of "Dixie," sat cross-legged with three companions in a little hall on the Bowery and gave to the world the first melody and humor of the first minstrelsy. Since the introduction of the black-faced semi-circle four decades ago, it has appealed season after season to varied hosts of amusement lovers. In the first part of Gus Hill's "Big Minstrels" the comedy and melody of the old semi-circle still remain. George Wilson "Waltz Me Again," a budget of new songs and a monologue funny enough to drive the most blasé into hysterics, and Eddie Mazier, the well-known black-faced comedian, will oblige with new songs and jokes. This season's singing contingent is said to be one of rare excellence. Watch out for the big street parade at high noon.

"Pollyanna" Coming.

The drawing power of "Pollyanna," the glad play which comes to the Grand Opera House for two nights, Thursday and Friday, April 11th and 12th, has been compared with "Ben Hur," and other noted successes. "Pollyanna" is now in its third season on the stage and has made its second trip around in Cleveland, Detroit, Milwaukee, St. Louis, and its box-office records show that its attendance even surpassed the first engagements in those cities. It is the same cast that appeared in New York City, Chicago, Boston and Philadelphia, and its producers, Klav and Erlanger and George C. Tyler, have even predicted it as a successor to the famous "Ben-Hur." "Pollyanna" was written in book form by Eleanor H. Porter, and dramatized by Catherine Chisholm Cushing. It is estimated that over 10,000,000 have read the glad books and more than 1,000,000 have witnessed the play.

At Griffin's.

A complete departure from her usual style of photoplay is found in Pauline Fredericks' newest Paramount picture, "Madame Jealousy," which pleased a large audience at the above playhouse last evening. This is an extremely picturesque allegorical photoplay which affords the actors chances for unusual dramatic acting. Charlie Chaplin was shown in a really funny picture, "The Adventurer," and he certainly crowded a lot of adventure into his three reels. The whole feature will be presented again to-night and to-morrow afternoon and night.

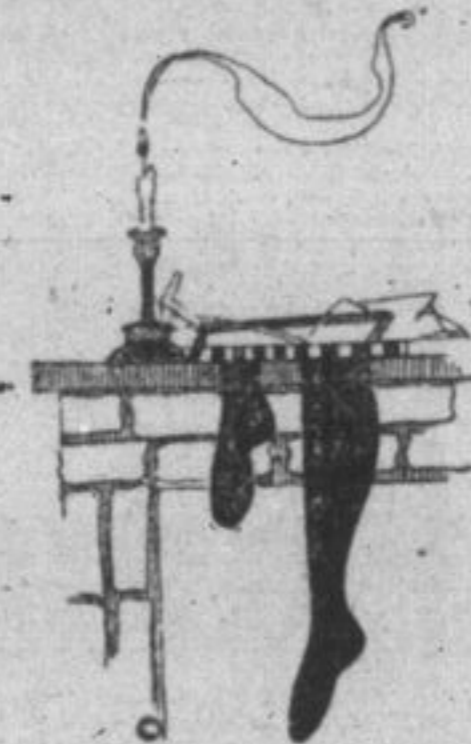
