**PENITENTIARIES AND JAILS**

Per Capita Cost in Pen Nearly Four Times As Much.

The estimates for the year 1918-19 have been placed upon the table in the House of Commons. The amount asked for penitentiaries is \$991,600.00, which is \$20,000 less than last year. It is interesting to note in this connection that the population of all the penitentiaries last year was 2,116 and the per capita cost was \$468.60. In a recent announcement by the Department of Justice that the inmates would be employed at greater production, it was stated that the population was reduced twenty-five per cent.

The forty-ninth report issued by the Provincial government upon prisons, reformatories, jails, etc., shows that the total number of inmates of jails was 16,000. The total expenditure was \$195,291.74, and the per capita cost only \$122.

QUIETLY MARRIED**

**Corpl. Kenneth Marlam Was Married on Thursday to Miss J. E. Pelow.**

On Thursday Janet Edythe Pelow, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Dennis Pelow, 38 Clergy street west, was married on Thursday by Rev. Fr. Hanley, to Corpl. Kenneth Marlam, son of Charles Marlam, Rochester, N.Y.

The groom left Kingston with the 8th Canadian Mounted Rifles in November, 1914, and on October 24th, 1915, was taken prisoner by the Germans. He escaped from the prison camp on November 13th, 1917, making a successful escape to England.

He came to Kingston a short time ago with a party of returning invalided soldiers.

The wedding was of a very quiet nature, being held in the Archbishop's Palace with only a few immediate friends and relatives being present.
