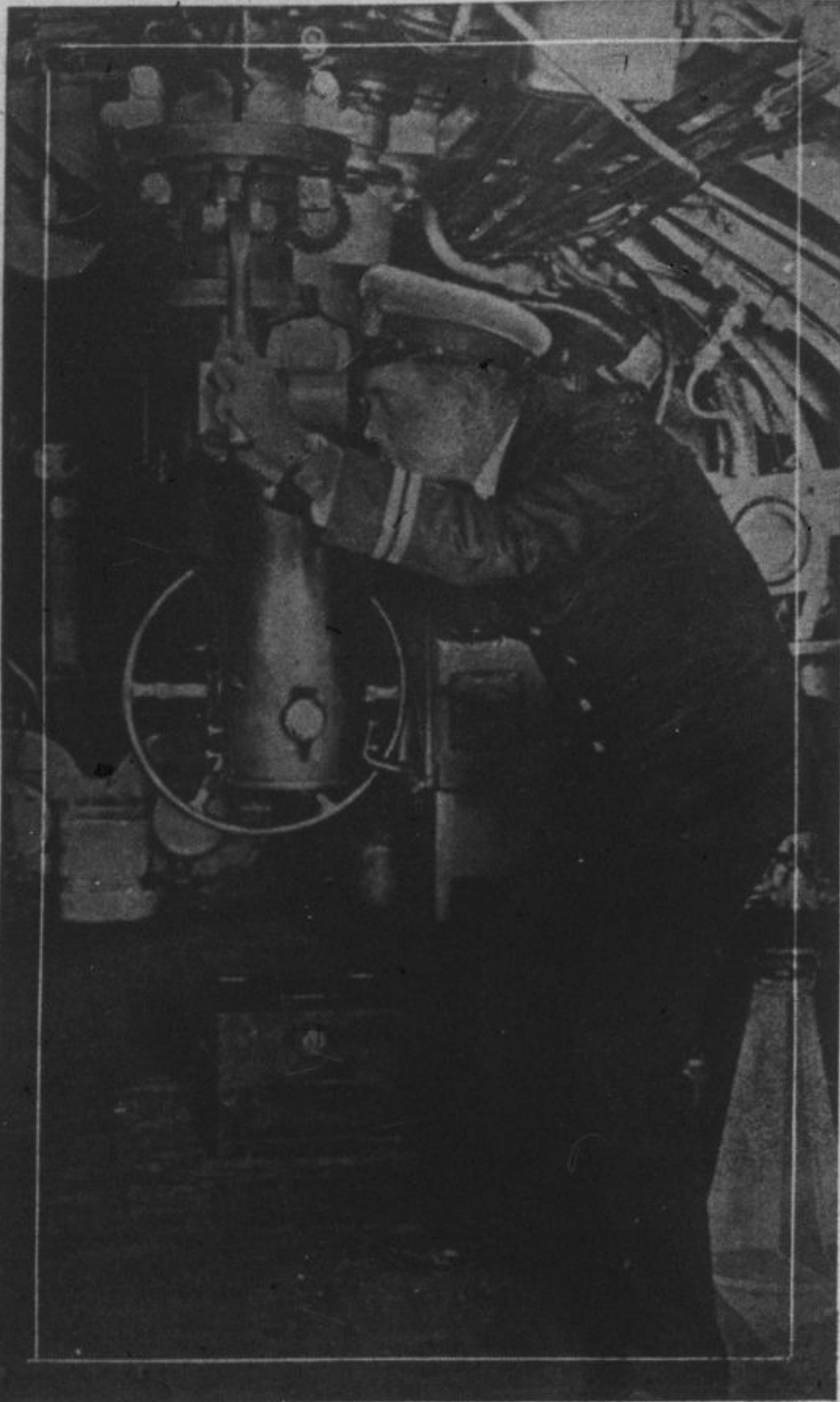

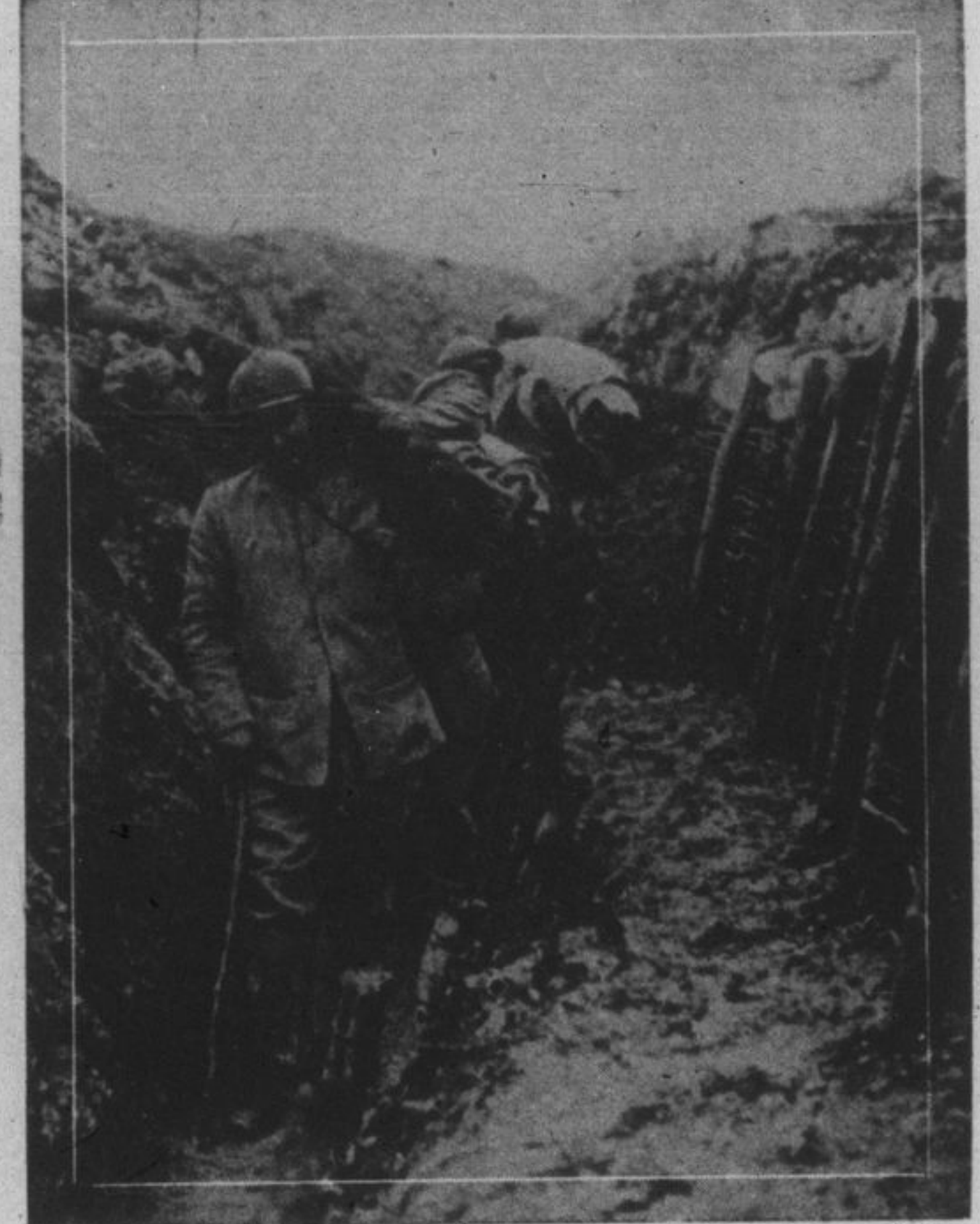
ALWAYS ON THE LOOKOUT

The commander of a British submarine with his eye at the periscope. In this position he directs all operations connected with an attack.



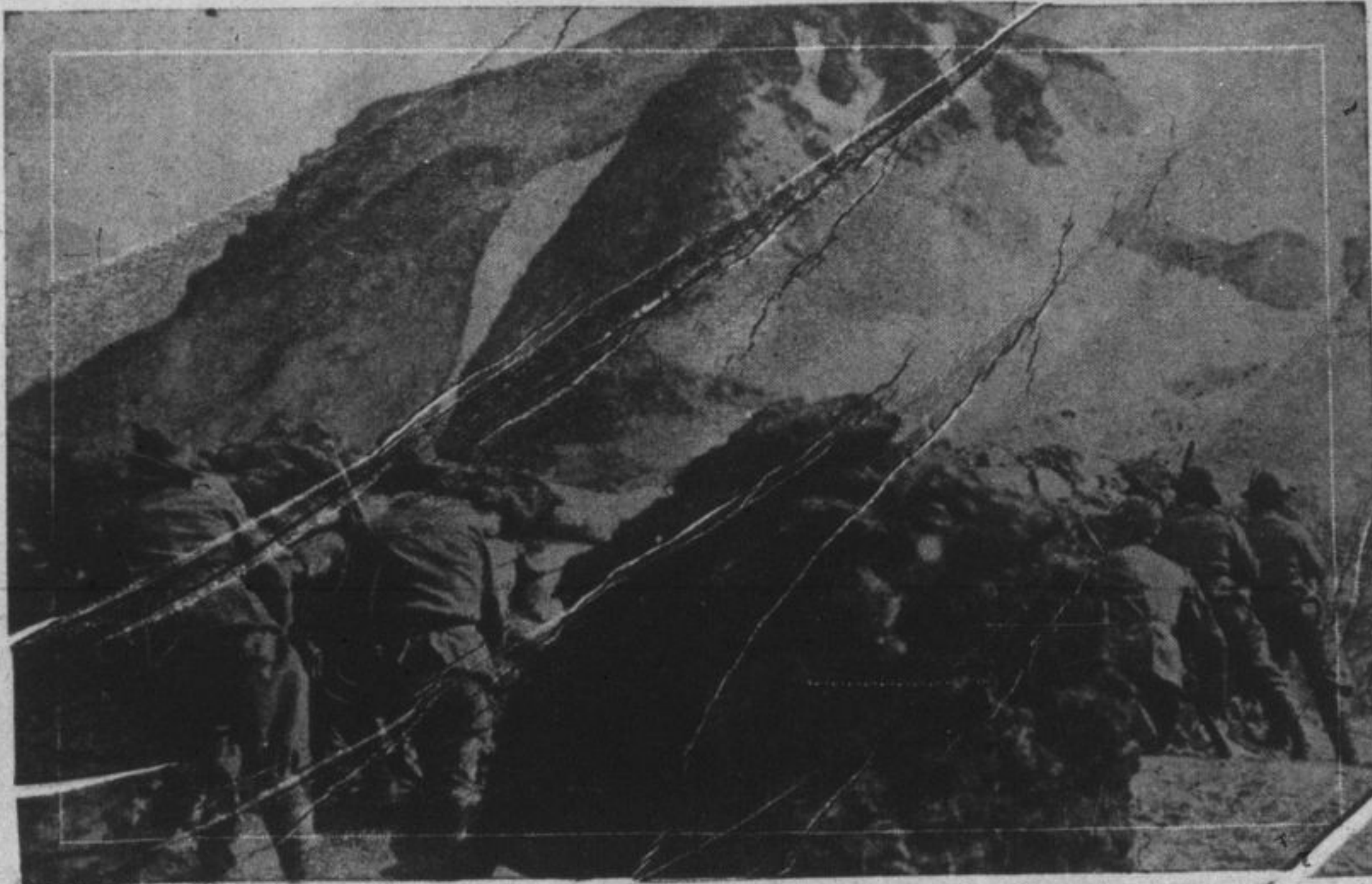
ON THE CANADIAN FRONT IN FRANCE

Canadian soldiers carrying a wounded comrade through the mud.



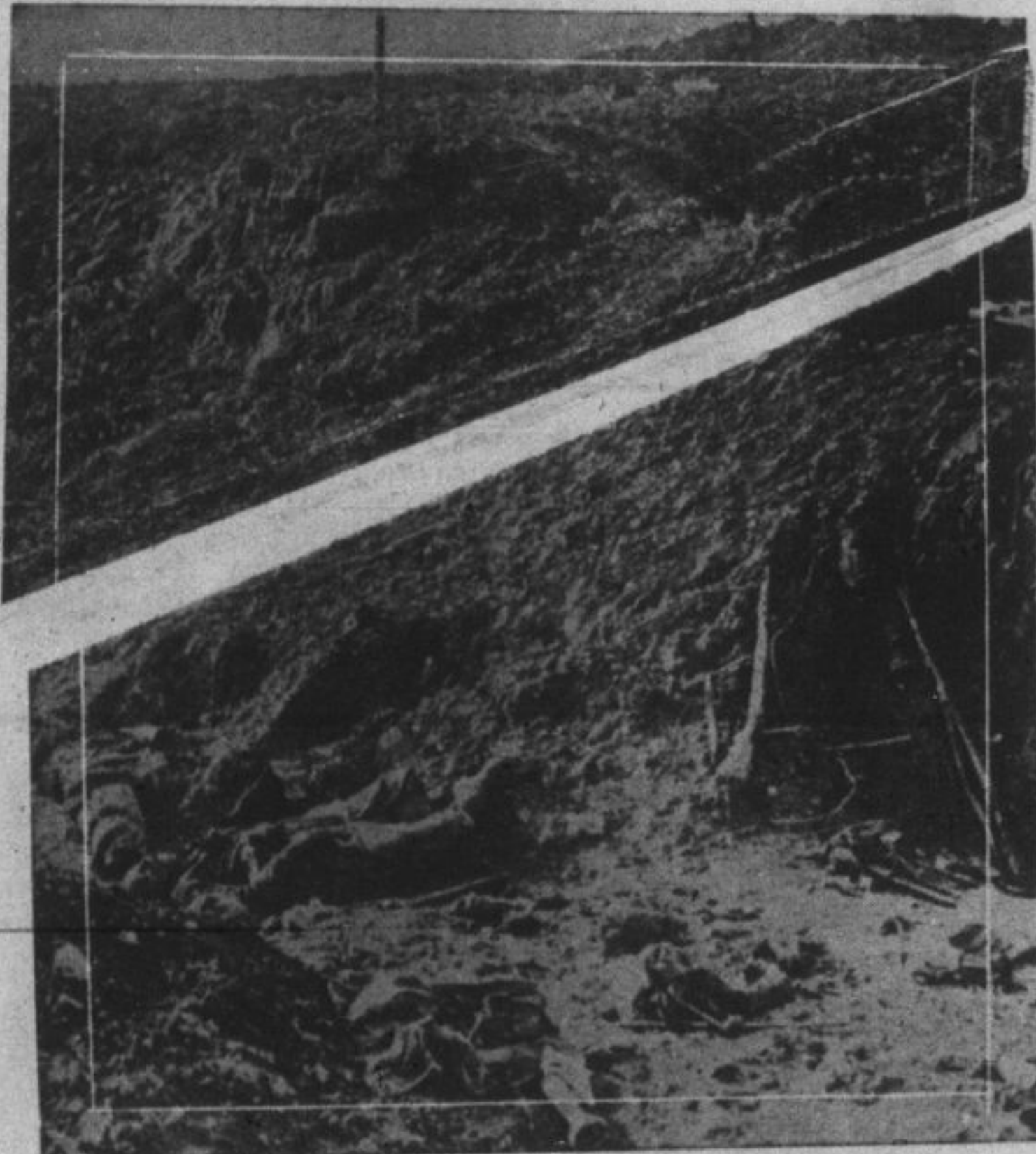
A FRENCH COMMUNICATION TRENCH

French poilus making their way along a communication trench carrying equipment with them.



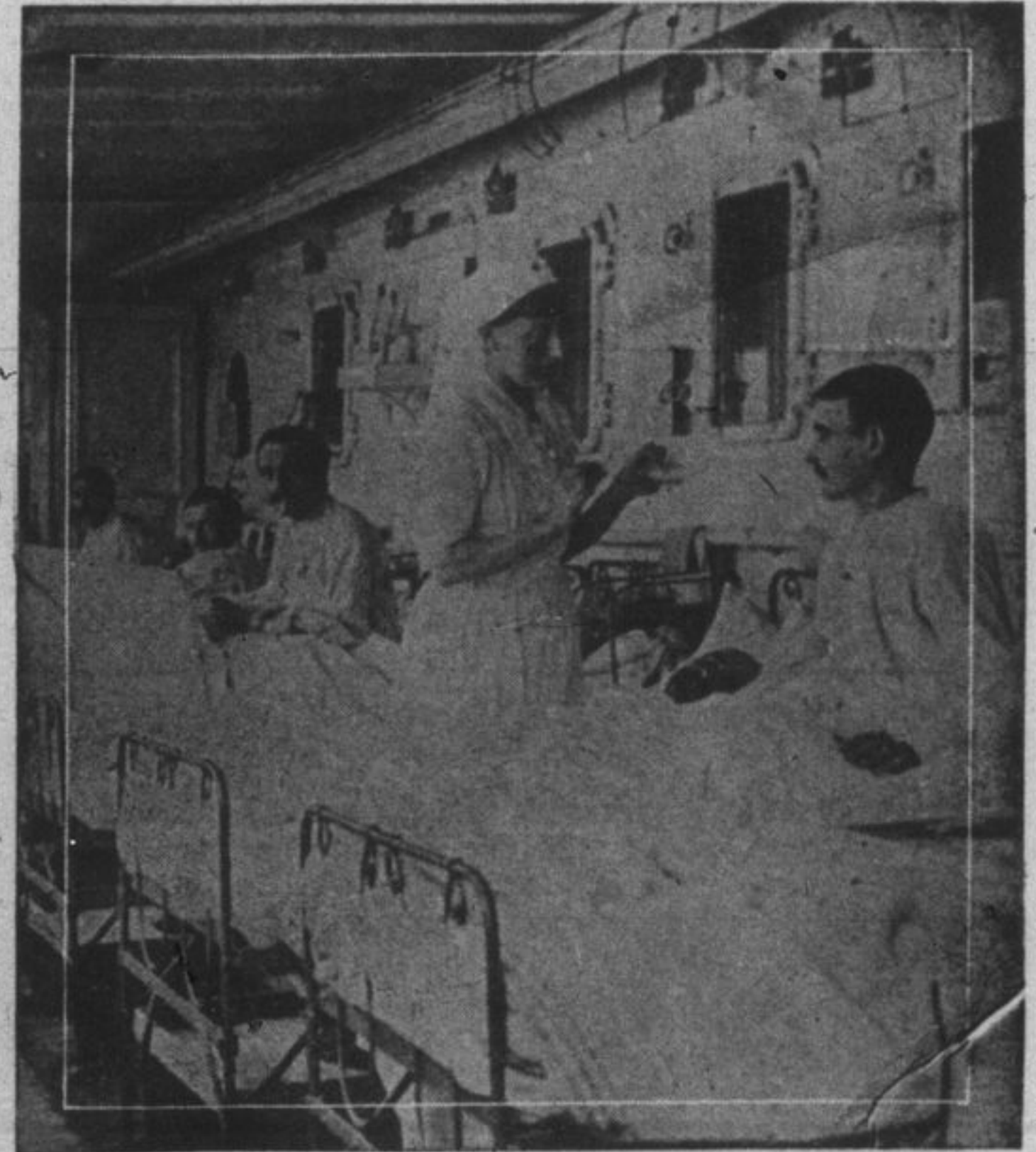
WITH OUR ITALIAN ALLIES

German dead lying in a deserted trench after an engagement.



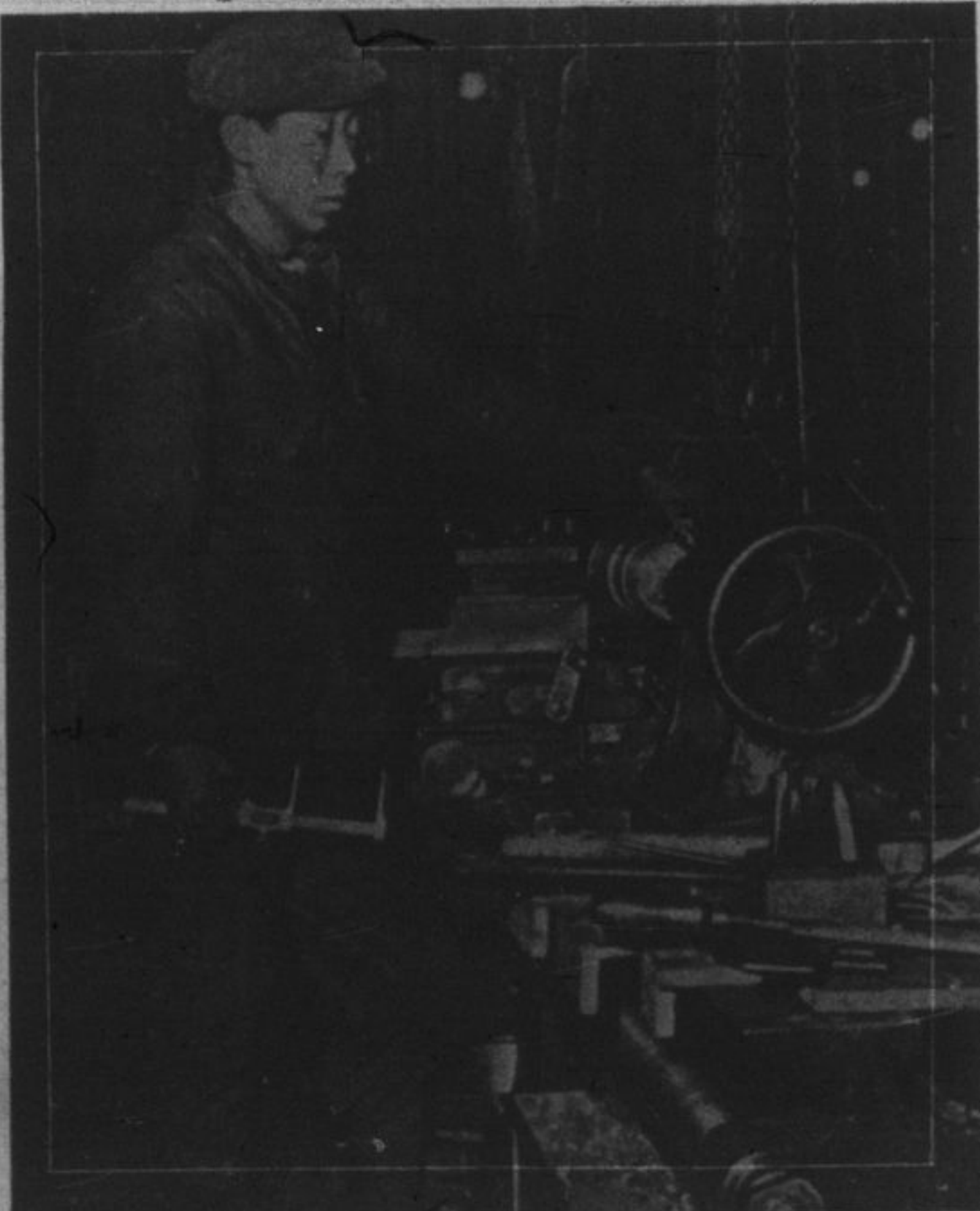
TROOPS ON BOARD A HOSPITAL SHIP

The result of successful shooting by the British. A section of German railway torn up by high explosive.



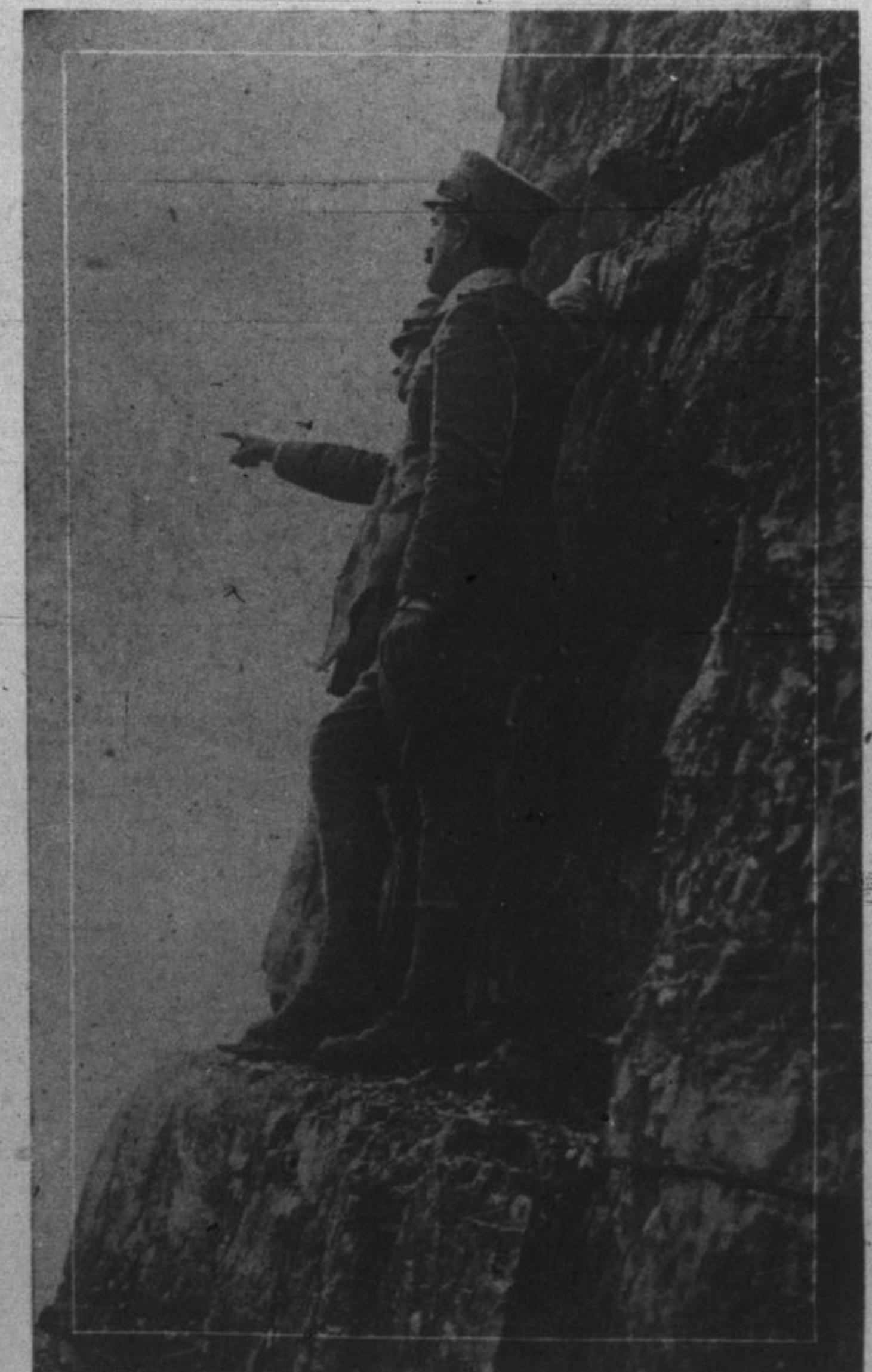
CHINESE LABOR USED IN SOLVING MANY PROBLEMS
