WANTS FRANKNESS OVER CONSCRIPTION

Sir Edward Carson Has Doubts of Government's Real Intentions.

London, April 17.—During the consideration of the man power bill in committee of the House of Commons, Sir Edward Carson appealed to the government to deal frankly with both the Irish members in the house and tell them plainly what kind of machinery they intended to set up. He said he found great difficulty in understanding where they were under the bill and was beginning to have grave doubts whether the government really meant to put it into effect or not.

The government, he said, made a vital mistake in its manner of introducing the measure and would make the state of feeling in Ireland tenfold worse if it kept the house longer in the dark.

GOBBLE THE FOOD.

Germany Forgot Hostilities On Capturing Supply Train.

With the British Armies in France, April 17.—The British unwittingly furnished a small force of Germans with a feast the day the enemy broke through the Portuguese and got around the British right flank at Bar St. Maur. A supply train loaded with rations was surrounded. The enemy immediately forgot hostilities and pounced on the train. According to their own statements the Germans saw white bread for the first time in several years. They also found jam and canned meats. Prisoners who were taken were surprised that the British Tommies were still getting such good food.

The Lindsay Thompson Flax Co.'s mill at Sarnia, with its contents, was destroyed by fire; loss placed at \$10,000.

WILL RESIST ACT.

(Canadian Press Despatch.) London, April 17.—The Irish Nationalist members of parliament having fought conscription to the last in the House of Commons are now leaving for Dublin to formulate plans for resisting it.
