NEW SCHEDULE OF RATES

UTILITIES COMMISSION TAKING UP MATTER FOR INDUSTRIES.
Hoped That Rates Will Be Secured That Will Be Of Advantage to Both Commission and Industries.—No Definite Action.
The Civil Utilities Commission held a conference on Friday afternoon with Engineer Kribs, of the Hydro-Electric Commission, in regard to new rates for power for industries, and it is hoped that rates will be secured that will be of advantage to both parties. Negotiations are now under way, and it is expected that a definite proposition will be ready for the regular meeting of the Utilities Commission which will be held on Monday afternoon. J. M. Campbell, acting for the city, went over estimates with the Hydro Commission men and decided on a schedule of rates which they are now working on, and the industries already approached are the Dominion Textile Company, the Canadian Locomotive Works, Kingston Hosiery Company and the city waterworks plant. The Hydro men have been in the city the past few days working on the matter. It is not the intention of the Commission to consider new rates for commercial and domestic and street lighting at the present time, but just as soon as the day load is built up the domestic and commercial lighting will be given attention. G. Y. Chown presided at the conference, and also present were Mayor Hughes, Commissioners T. J. Rigney, R. N. F. Macfarlane and Robert Elliott, and J. M. Campbell and Hugh Nickle.

A TRULY REMARKABLE FILM

Of Jules Verne's Famous Novel "20,000 Leagues Under the Sea."
Fifty years ago Jules Verne wrote a novel entitled "20,000 Leagues Under the Sea." At the time he was given credit for having created a piece of fiction which exceeded even the wildest imagination of his age. It was referred to as a gigantic piece of impossibility, but which showed in a remote way the things which were within the bounds of the author's imagination. The author was simply fifty years ahead of his time. On Friday afternoon and evening the motion photographs of his story were shown to crowded houses at the Grand Opera House. Instead of her dreams being beyond possibilities of actual existence, they have been realized, and those pictures showed the marvelous progress made in submarine work in deep sea diving and in under-water photography. The picture is one of the most interesting, instructive and gripping films ever shown here. It is introduced by pictures of the Williamson brothers, who have done so much to make under-water photography possible and then there is unfolded one of the greatest stories in literary history. There are scenes taken far under the ocean's surface which show sharks swimming round apparently into the mouth of the camera. There is a scene of a struggle between an octopus and a pearl diver, the diver being rescued through the good services of the "Monster," which is the submarine of the film. The beautiful scenery of the tropics and grandeur of the jungle, combine in rounding out a truly magnificent entertainment. The film is being repeated this (Saturday) afternoon and evening and should be viewed by large audiences.

"You're In Love."

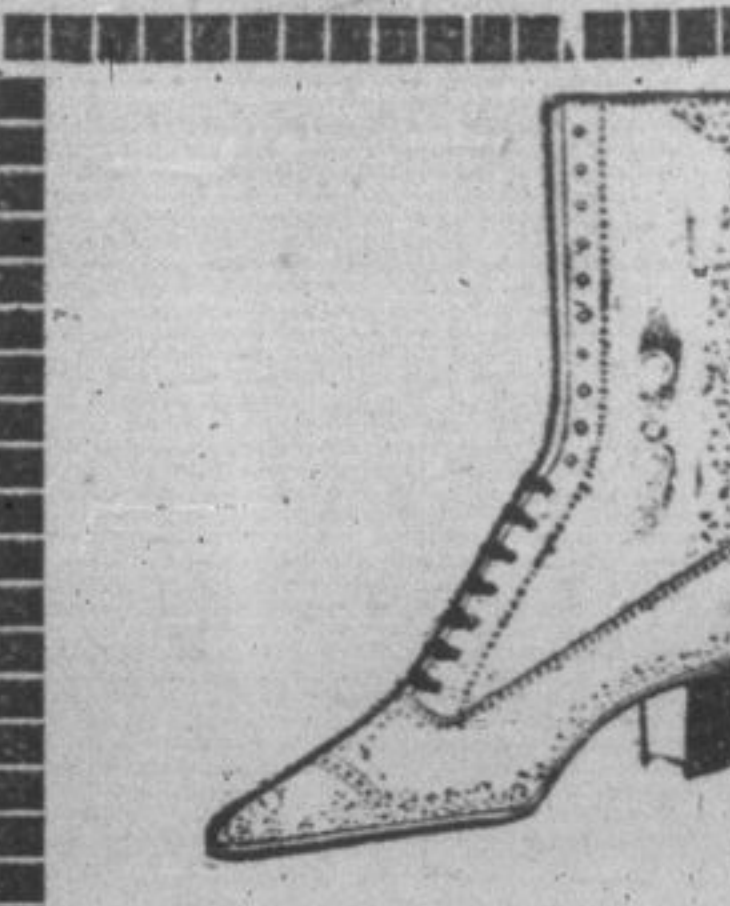
