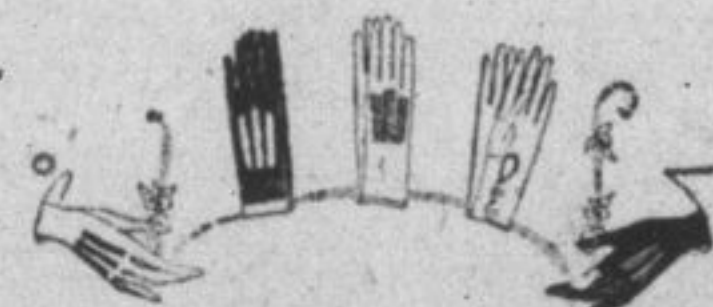
DIED.

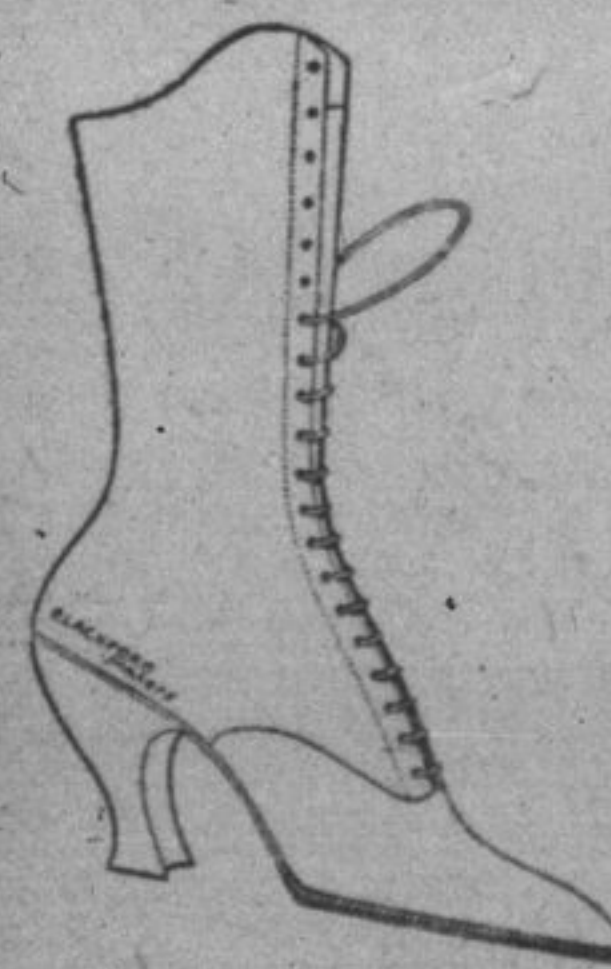
