The Cheese Factories Are Opening Up-Pasture Slow.

The cheese factories are opening up gradually in the Brockville and Belleville dairy sections, says the Trade Bulletin, but advices from that rain was badly needed to bring on the pastures; but it will no doubt come in due time. The factorymen are now anxiously awaiting the action of the Dairy Produce Commission in fixing the price for the coming season. One factoryman writes to a firm here to the effect that he is making full preparations for the coming make regardless of what the price will be. This is the righ spirit in which to look at the question, as the chief object of all factorymen should be to turn out as large a production of cheese as possible during the coming season. The factorymen may rely upon the price fixed by the Dairy Produce Commis-sion being sufficiently profitable to turn out as large a make as possible. They want the cheese, and will be prepared to pay good value for them. The Commission are paying for old cheese 21 3-4c for No. 1, 21 1-4c for No. 2 and 30 3-4c for No. 3; and it is confidently expected that the fixed prices for 1918 will
