WHEATLESS MONTHS.

New York Commissioner Wants Sacrifice Till Harvest.

New York, April 26.—An appeal to mothers in New York state asking them to pledge themselves and members of their households to abstain entirely from the use of wheat and wheat products until the next harvest, was issued yesterday, by John Mitchell, President of the New York Food Commission and State Chairman of the Federal Food Board.

"Wheat must be saved," says the appeal. "It is needed abroad for American, English, Irish, Scotch, Canadian, Australian, French and Italian youths fighting for you and civilization. It is a big part of their daily sustenance."

"In all sections of the country there is a general movement for total abstinence from wheat and wheat products until the next harvest. In New York city 75,000 clubmen have voluntarily surrendered to a wheatless program."

Total abstinence is not expected, however, in families whose members engage in manual labor, if it means more than it is "humanly possible to perform."

HOW FOCH WAS APPOINTED

Result of Conference Between Milner and Clemenceau.

London, April 26.—That the masterly retreat of the British Army in the face of great odds would live in history, Clemenceau has assured Lord Milner. There is no division of opinion on this subject among the British and French peoples. Apropos of the meeting of these statesmen a remarkable story is told of how at the time of the greatest crisis a telegram to Lloyd George, asking him to send Milner, believing that between them they could formulate a plan to stem the flood of the German advance. Just as he finished writing the door opened and Milner entered. Together they conferred with Foch and Fetsin. The outcome of the conference was the appointment of a generalissimo.

NEW FEDERAL EXPRESS CO.

Name Suggested For Merged Companies With Capital of \$34,000,000

Washington, April 26.—Railroad administration officials and express company representatives conferred on terms of a tentative contract under which the companies would be merged with capital of \$34,000,000 to act as a Government agent in express business, but without direct Government control. A name suggested for the new concern is the Federal Express Company.

Orders For 66 Steamers.

Cleveland, April 26.—An order was booked here by the Emergency Fleet Corporation with the American Shipbuilding Company, which calls for the construction and delivery of sixty-six steamers for salt water service early in 1919. The order is the largest ever placed on the Great Lakes. The cost of the vessels will be in excess of fifty million dollars. Of full canal size the boats will be of an average capacity of 4,000 tons each, 261 feet in length and 43.5 beam.
