LICENSEE INSPECTOR SAMPLED BEEF, IRON AND WINE.

There is always something new in Kingston. William McCammon, Licensee Inspector of Wine, was responsible for the new "stunt" pulled off on Friday morning. No, it was not whiskey, just a bottle of beef, iron and wine, but a young fellow who was arrested some time ago stated that all he had been drinking was beef, iron and wine, and for this reason who made the sale of three or perhaps more bottles of the beef, iron and wine, was summoned to walk the carpet. Mr. McCammon, after taking the sample from the bottle, gave it as his opinion, under oath, that it was of an intoxicating nature.
