AN ERNEST APPEAL.
Lieut. C. W. Topping Described Military Y.M.C.A. on Sunday.

One of the most earnest appeals on behalf of the Military Y.M.C.A. campaign for funds was made in Queen Street church on Sunday morning by Lieut. C. W. Topping, governor of the jail. Lieut. Topping made the appeal at a returned soldier who, knowing the work that is being accomplished by the Military Y.M.C.A. in France, asked those at home to support it for the sake of those soldiers who have not yet returned. In his ten minutes talk he described in a graphic way the hero of the "Y" as he had found them. He referred to the death of one of the "Y" officers, who though a non-combatant, had been killed in action. This death was described in an article in Saturday's Whig by Capt. McNab, of Queen's Military Hospital and Lieut. Topping showed how absolutely vital the captain had been in relating the story.
