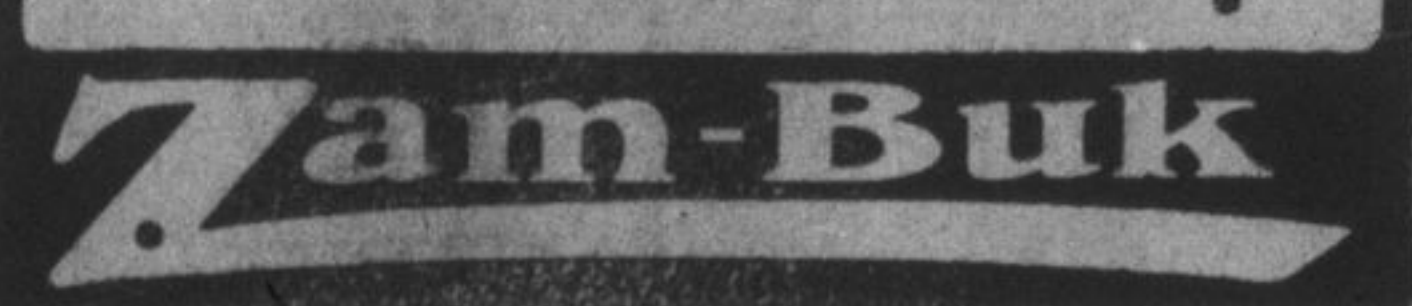

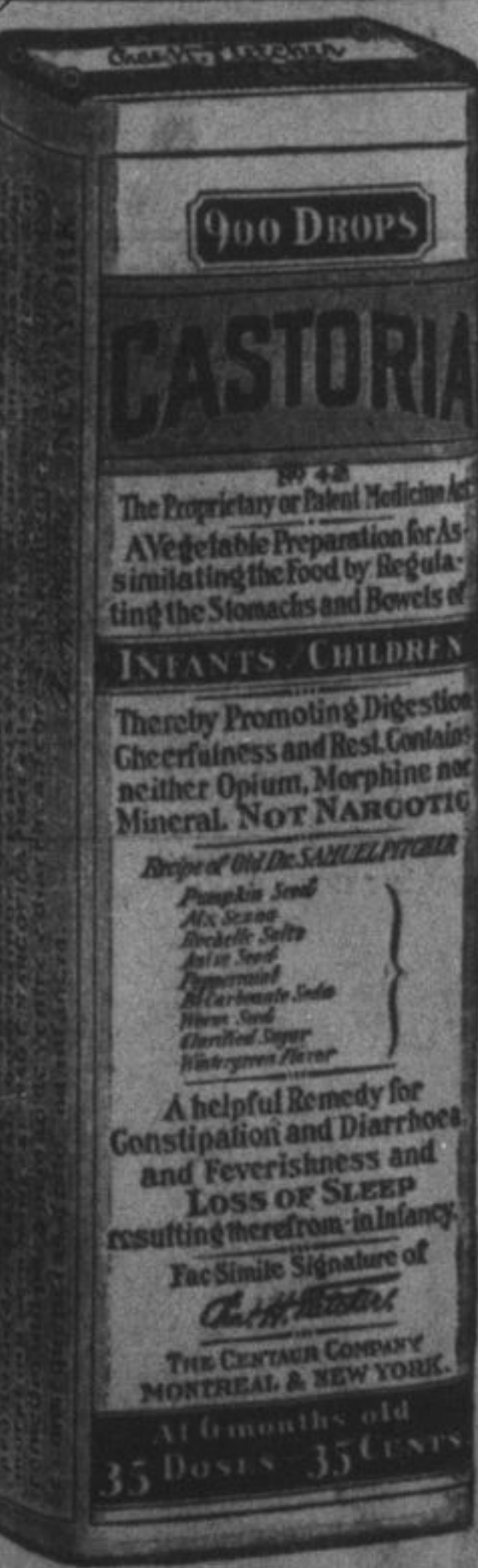

THE WORST IS YET TO COME

FEELING EACH OTHER OUT IS ALL THAT HAS BEEN DONE BY ELEMENTS.

A Cordial Feeling Has Grown Up Between the Quebec Members and the Western Radicals.

Ottawa, May 14.—The net result of this year's crisis session has been to indicate symptoms rather than to aggravate complaints.

Parliament has not sized itself up yet. Even that cock-sure philosopher, the Ottawa correspondent, hasn't made up his mind about it.

It has been so little anxious to disclose its real sentiments on the great domestic issues that it chose, for example, to spend a whole afternoon on the question of grading hay.

At all events Parliament preferred to discuss hay rather than the tariff, there being a gentleman's agreement not to gouge each other's eyes out on this vexed subject until the Hun has been dealt with.

What Union Government must be prepared to meet after this war is of our minds, is a Parliament with half a dozen or more big cleavages of opinion.

Senator Richardson agreed that any two sides of a triangle are together greater than the third side, and this is in favor of the idea of the Georgian Bay canal route.

The experience of the United States with its inland waterways and canals is of interest at the present time.

Representative John H. Small, chairman of the Harbors Committee of the House, pointed out that these waterways and canals had been bought up by the railways and abandoned, and the inertia of the public was blamed for permitting such things to take place.

Among other things that certain people in the east will be in earnest about is the tariff. Gazing at them with the naked eye, I find Cockshutt of Brantford, and those of his tribe just as resolute for the high wall and no breaches as ever.

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Slackers in Hiding. Report to N.Y. Says Thousands in Maine Woods.

New York, May 14.—A despatch from Bangor, Maine, to the World, says: Rumors persist that there are hiding in the forests of northern Maine hundreds, if not thousands of Canadians, who are either too proud or too timid to fight for their country.

It is known that military officers have done some investigating, but it is practically impossible to find and identify a man who buries himself in a wilderness that stretches a hundred miles east and two hundred miles north and south.

The fact that one of the big lumbering concerns has not been obliged to come to Bangor for its log rivers this spring indicates that a new source of labor supply has suddenly been developed up north.

Port Hope, May 14.—John Paard, aged seventy years, toll-taker-keeper about five miles from here, was instantly killed early Sunday morning, when struck by an automobile in which were James Rooney and E. Plunkett, Cobourg.

It is said that the aged keeper, when he saw the auto coming, started to cross the road to be in a position to collect the toll, and was struck by the machine before he could clear the road.

Roosevelt to Tour. To House the Patriotic Spirit in the Middle West.

New York, May 14.—The National Security League announced yesterday that it had enlisted Colonel Theodore Roosevelt for its campaign for "patriotism through education."

The Colonel will start next week on a tour of Middle West, speaking under the auspices of the league in Ohio, Michigan, Iowa and Wisconsin.

Outlining the general form of the message which he will carry, the Colonel declared to the directors of the campaign that he would lay particular stress on the following three topics: First, win the war and win it now; second, preparedness after the war; including the necessity for active Americanization propaganda to awaken a more responsive and responsible citizenship.

The Colonel's tour will start at Wilton, Col., on Saturday, May 25th. This event will be particularly significant because Wittenberg is a German Lutheran school in the heart of the German-American region of Ohio.

Mr. Yattman, of Illinois, will deliver the invocation and only men of German birth and parentage will occupy the seats on the platform.

SEIZED TERRITORY. Finland Seeks Access to Arctic Ocean Now.

Stockholm, May 14.—It is reported from Kirkenes that a small detachment of Finnish Government troops has arrived at Boris-Gleb and hoisted the Finnish flag, declaring the district Finnish territory.
