REGISTRATION REGULATIONS

FOR EVERY PERSON BETWEEN AGES OF 16 AND 60

Registration Offices to be Open From 7 A.M. Till 10 P.M.—Penalties Are Fixed For Those Who Disobey the Proclamation.

The Governor-General has approved the following regulations which go into effect on the day to be set by proclamation for the registration of all persons, male, female, British or alien in Canada over sixteen years of age; and every such person who shall, after the day appointed for registration, attain his sixteenth birthday, register. The exceptions are: nuns and any persons upon active service in any of His Majesty's military or naval forces; insane and prisoners and inmates of institutions exempted by the board.

The central registry will be established at Ottawa, superintended under the Canada Registration Board, and a registrar for each district. Each district will be divided into divisions conforming to the last polling divisions in use. Deputy registrar and clerks will be appointed to facilitate the work.

Notices will be posted in conspicuous places specifying the location of the places fixed for registration.

Every person who shall have attained his sixteenth birthday on or before the day appointed by the proclamation, shall attend on the day of registration, and as early as possible, and shall truthfully answer all questions printed on the registration card and sign it. When this has been completed a certificate of registration will be given to the person so registering by the deputy registrar.

On the day of registration the offices will be opened at 7:00 a.m. and remain open till 10:00 o'clock at night.

Every person who attains the age of sixteen after the day of registration shall register within thirty days of the said birthday and every person who has been on active service in the naval or military forces must register within thirty days after having ceased to be upon active service. The registration in these cases will be made at any post office and the postmaster's receipt shall be deemed to be a registration certificate pending the receipt of the latter.

When there has been delay in registering the reason for failure to register on the day appointed by proclamation, must be stated. Illness will be a satisfactory excuse provided registration is made as soon as possible after recovery.

Should a certificate be lost, destroyed or defaced, a new one will be issued on application to the central registrar.

Officials and clerks are to observe secrecy respecting the information in their keeping under a penalty of a fine of \$500 and imprisonment not exceeding three months.

If any person required to register on the days set by proclamation shall without lawful excuse omit, neglect or fail to register; or if any person who is required to register after the day so appointed and without lawful excuse fails to register, shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of one hundred dollars and to imprisonment for one month; and to a further penalty of \$10 a day for each day after the day when he should have registered, he shall forfeit his right to vote at a Dominion election; and if he fails to register within thirty days after the time when he should have registered he shall be disqualified to vote at the next Dominion election; he forfeits his right to wages, salary, and employment and if an employer shall be disqualified to the services of anyone in his employ; he shall not be permitted to travel on any public conveyance.

Every person must carry his certificate with him, and on demand and if he refuses or neglects to do so shall be liable to a penalty of \$20.

Every male person may be questioned by a peace officer, or military officer or military police.

THE SEASON IS CURTAILED

RIVER SEASON OPENS JUNE 22ND AND ENDS SEPT. 1ST.

Steamers Riverside and Island Belle to Conduct Entire Service This Season, Which Will Be Month Shorter Than Usual.

The steamer Toronto of the R. & O. fleet will begin her trips between Toronto and Prescott on June 22nd, making three times a week until July 1st, when the steamer Kingston will be added, providing a daily service until Labor Day, when the season will end. The season will be one month shorter than usual, the boats formerly starting out on June 15th and continuing until Sept. 15th. An expected decrease in tourist travel, due to the war, is responsible for the curtailment. The company's freight boats are now running between Hamilton and Montreal, and will continue in operation until the close of navigation.

Present indications point to greatly decreased boat service in the Thousand Islands this season, as the steamer Thousand Islander, Ramona and St. Lawrence are to be tied up this year on account of war conditions. This will leave only the steamers Riverside and Island Belle in service this year. These boats are owned by the Holmes Bros. of Redwood, and in recent years have plied between Alexandria Bay, Clayton and Ogdensburg. It is said to be the intention of the Holmes Bros. to operate the Riverside among the islands and the Island Belle on the Ogdensburg route.

A Human Ostrich.
The chief of police, Brockville, has received word from the warden of the Kingston penitentiary stating that the Brockville prisoner who played the part of the ostrich in swallowing sixty buttons was James E. Roderick. He was sentenced in November last, after pleading guilty to the theft of seven bicycles. His home was at Cornwall, engaged in the tailoring department with ready access to the buttons.
