CHILDREN NEED MUSICAL TRAINING NOW AS IN PEACE TIMES  
Shall the study of music be discontinued in War Time? For those who only study to pass away the time it certainly should. What shall we say about those who take their music seriously? When the child begins to take lessons, regular practice hours are set down by the parents, and thus the habit of regularity is formed. If the child has the right kind of teacher and his interest in music awakened, he will work very hard to obtain certain results. As he continues, he will be constantly adding to his powers of mental endurance. As his powers of endurance increase, so his power of self-control will also increase. He will realize the things he wants to do, and he will acquire self-control enough to do them and put aside other temptations. Is this not worth seeking for? Many children as they grow older suffer unconsciously from their pent-up emotions, and these often lead them into trouble. Now, if he has really got into the spirit of his music, one will find there an outlet for his feelings that will carry him over many dangerous places in life. Any study that can give such training to the mind must be included in the general education of the child.
