That is Mike Finn's rating of his new importation to the Southern League, who is leading the Southern in hitting.

Flagstead, a right-hander, had played in only 52 professional games in his life when he reported to Chattanooga this spring. He was with Tacoma, in the Northwestern League. That club kept him on the bench for a while, and then began playing him at various positions—behind the bat, at third base and in the outfield.

Manager Finn was told to use Flagstead as a catcher, and when he reported Finn expected to use him behind the bat.

"But he wouldn't work as a catcher," said Mike, telling the story. "I said he'd quit the game first. So I sent him to the outfield, and I am glad I did, for he is a star in every sense of the word. There is nothing he doesn't seem able to do. He is a good fielder, thrower, and as a batter there are few in baseball his equal."

Lee Magee continues to hit the ball for Matty's Reds, and he has played no small part in the recent successes of the Redland team.

Both George Burns and Clarence Walker are playing a brilliant game for Connie Mack, and hitting the ball to various sections of the field as well as into the bleachers.

Jack Hendricks is having his troubles at St. Louis, but it would be unfair to blame it on Jack. His star are in a slump with the stick.

The weakness of the Detroit team with the stick is a big puzzle in view of the fact that the team includes such hitters as Cobb, Veach, Heilman and several other dangerous batsmen.

Catcher Bill Kelly, last year with the Leafs, has been secured from the St. Louis Browns by the Omaha Club. Bill joins Marty O'Toole, his former

battery mate, the pair having been sold some years ago to the Pittsburgh Club for the reputed price of \$28,500.

The veteran Lefty Leifield is with the St. Louis Browns, but he is not being used very often, except to finish up games.

The Boston Red Sox lead all major league clubs in the matter of players having enlisted. Fourteen Red Sox are now in the service.

MAY LOSE SPEAKER.

Champion Bateman May Be Called Upon to Join Army.

Though the Cleveland team is playing first division ball, the team is an uncertain prospect, even though the major league races last through the summer. Ray Chapman, the shortstop, and one of the best in the draft, has already enrolled in the naval reserves at Cleveland, and may be called up next month. "Glad" Graney, who is a Canadian from St. Thomas, Ont., has also enrolled, and Josh Billings, a catcher, is already in. Manager Fohl has no capable substitute for Chapman, and if he goes the Cleveland infield will be a wreck. Miller, the first baseman, does not impress one as being a first-class man, and neither does Hall, the third baseman. The veteran Terry Turner is still with the tribe. He played a few innings yesterday, but he is no longer a star.

Tris Speaker is also in the draft, and may be summoned soon, though he supports his mother. Manager Fohl is fortunate in being able to muster a staff of good pitchers, but he doesn't know what moment he may lose his star fielders and hitters.

For Canadian Athletes. A finely equipped sports ground is to be opened towards the end of the current month for the use of the Canadian Military Athletic Association, London area. The ground is at Norbury, on the south side of London, and was for many seasons used by bank clerks' athletic clubs. The opening event will include track and field sports, and a baseball watch, the general public being admitted to the ground free—just to let the average Londoner see what Canadian sportsmen can do.

PLENTY OF GAMES FOR BELGIAN TEAMS

The American Soccer Champions Offer Contest—Prominent Combinations Accept

The challenge of the Belgian soccer team, offering to play one or more international matches in the United States for the benefit of the War Relief Fund, has already been accepted by several prominent combinations. The United States Soccer Association forwarded a telegram to the Commission on Training Camp Activities on behalf of the Bethlehem Steel Field Club, offering the services of the national championship team for such a contest. The Bethlehem club, which recently defeated the Fall River Rovers in the annual titular match, has agreed to meet the famous Belgian army players at any time or place designated by the Commission without share of the receipts or expense compensation.

ZBYNSKO IN CUSTODY.

Polish Wrestler Held on Ellis Island by U.S. Authorities.

The report that Wladek Zbyszko, the Polish wrestler, claimant for the heavyweight championship of the world, was held in custody on Ellis Island, was confirmed by the federal authorities at New York. Zbyszko, it was stated, was detained under the United States immigration law. Zbyszko is said to have endeavored to enlist in various branches of the service, but was rejected because of defective hearing. He has a brother, Stanislaus, also a wrestler, reported to be a prisoner in Germany because of pro-Ally sentiments.

Received Forty Cents.

According to report from Oakland players who went to work in shipyards, with baseball on the side, expecting to make some money out of the "side," are due for disappointment.

One of the "shipyard league" games played in Oakland on a Sunday day, the split for the players was 75 cents each. They thought the next Sunday would be better and tried it again.

The attendance was even less than before, and the split per player was 40 cents. In the maritime Government orders have gone out that every man at shipbuilding shall do a full day's work.

Chatham Golf Club.

Chatham will have a golf course shortly. The Indian Creek land syndicate has been formed to take over the Michigan estate of 105 acres near Indian Creek at the southerly limits of the city. The property will be leased to the Chatham Golf Club, which is in process of formation.

The purchase price is now subscribed, and the funds needed for improvements will be solicited at once from men who are interested in the project. Golf men declare the grounds particularly adapted for a good course.
