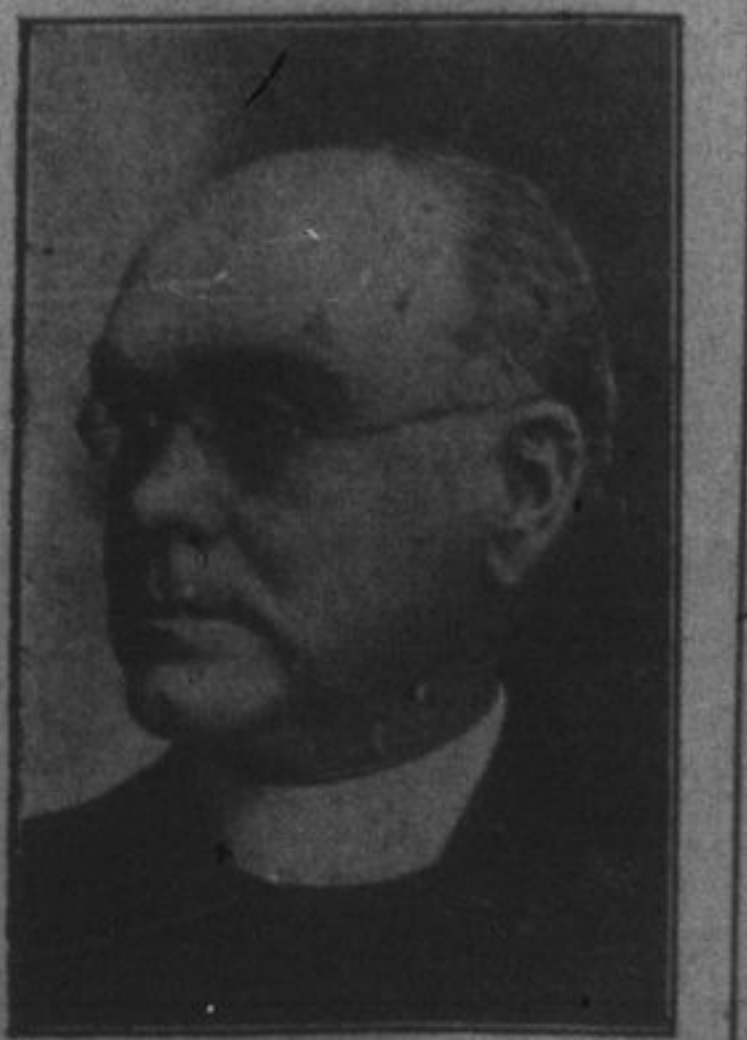

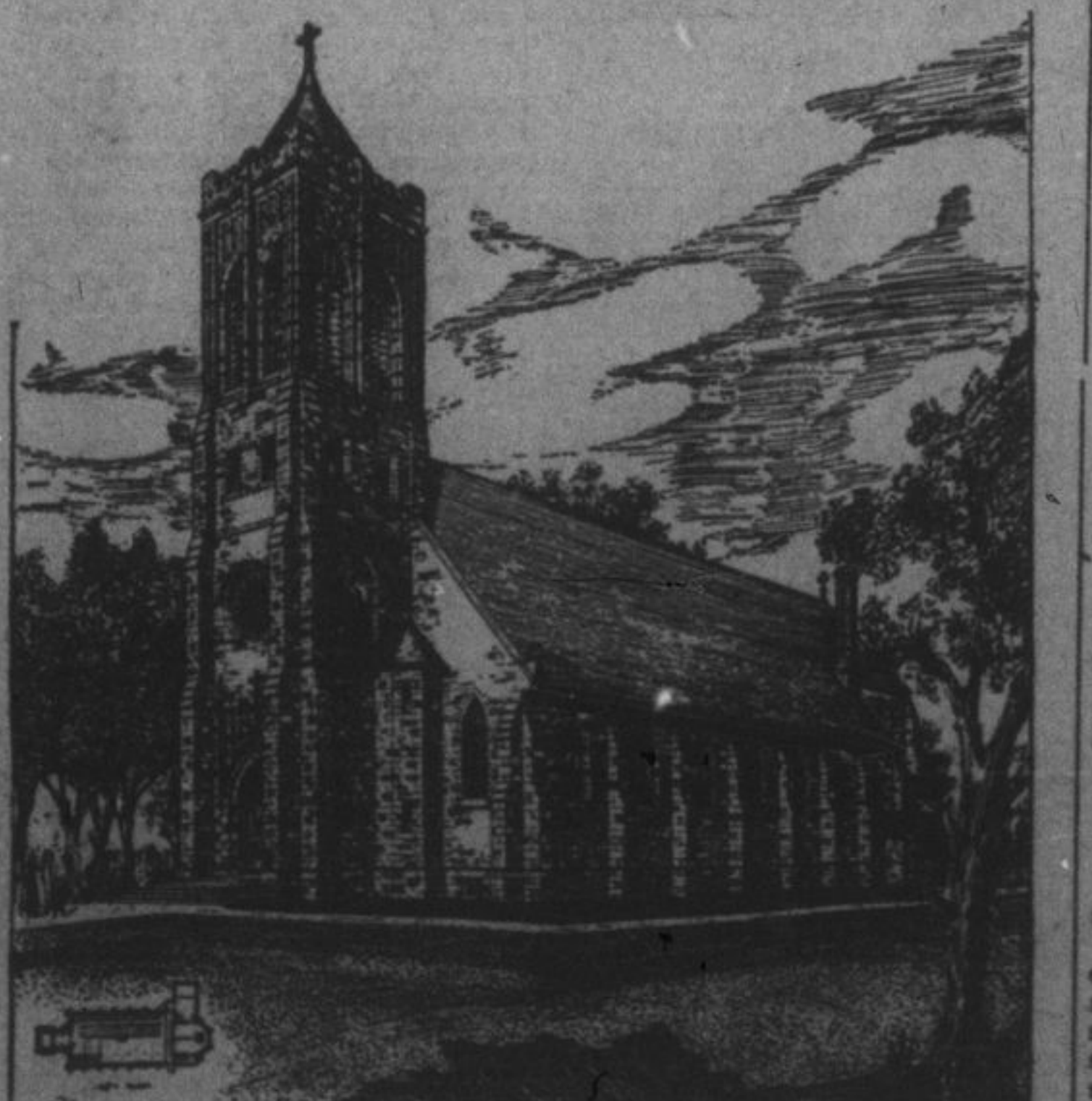
UNIQUE POSITION OF PREMIER BORDEN. Imperial Conference Likely to Grant Any Demands Canada Puts Forward.
