PART PLAYED BY LOW FLYING AEROPLANE IN MODERN WARFARE



One of the most remarkable features of the great battles now being fought on the western front is the part played by the low flying aeroplanes of the allied forces, which attack the enemies' troops with bombs and machine gun fire from a very low altitude. In many instances the main roads have been cleared of enemy troops, which have been forced to take to the open country. Many of the airmen have gone back of the German line and, flying no higher than five hundred feet, have dropped bombs in the masses of moving troops. After scattering large columns by this means the airmen have chased them with deadly machine gun fire, inflicting many casualties.
