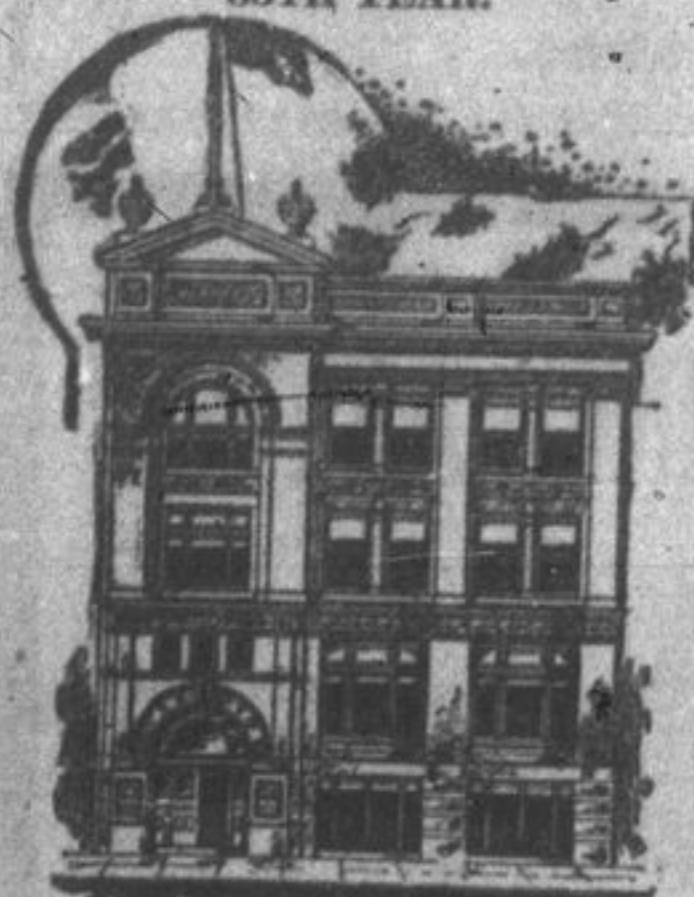

AMERICA IN THE WAR.

The United States is about to make her weight felt on the western front. The following are the official figures issued by Secretary Baker showing the despatch of troops to France since May 20th, 1917.
