THE WORLD'S NEWS IN BRIEF FORM

Tidings From All Over Told in a Pithy and Pointed Way.

Basset Blowett, husband of Jean Blowett, the writer, is dead.

Kansas' great wheat crop has been harvested with unusual success.

There are over 3,000 absentees and defaulters in the Toronto Military District.

England and Peru have signed a convention establishing a peace and arbitration commission.

The Soybean may be introduced into Canada as a substitute for cereals and other foodstuffs.

The Winnipeg Telegram newspaper, recently burned out, will resume publication early in August.

More than 12,000,000 feet of airplane spruce has been cut on Queen Charlotte Island since April.

Armand Lavergne, K.C., will take an action for libel to the amount of \$10,000 against the Quebec L'Evenement.

Of the 637,929 American troops taken to Europe in the months of April, May and June, 350,956 were carried in British ships.

Countess Alexandra Vlado von Scheele was arrested at New York as a dangerous enemy alien by agents of the Department of Justice.

A temporary embargo has been placed on the passage of motor cars between Nova Scotia or New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island.

Sherman J. Miller, a farmer about twenty years of age, in Hallowell township, committed suicide by shooting while temporarily insane.

The Chief Constables' Association decided to ask the Government to make it an offence for anyone engaged in administration of the law to join a trade union.

The results of the East Finsbury, London, election are: H. E. Cotton, coalitionist, 1,136; Capt. Spencer Pemberton-Billing, 576; A. S. Belsler, Independent, 199.

The United States this week passed regulations so that a bar of soap cannot be brought from the United States into Canada without a license from Washington.

District agricultural representatives, in conference at the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, on the farm labor question, had nothing, but praise for the farmerettes.

A new shipbuilding concern, capitalized at \$5,000,000 has been formed and will operate one of the largest shipyards in America on the shores of the St. Lawrence river opposite Quebec City.

Austria is ready for peace negotiations. Baron Burian has approved of much in Wilson's July 4th speech. "We are prepared to discuss everything," said Baron Burian, "except our own territory."
