THE WORLD'S NEWS IN BRIEF FORM
 Tidings From All Over Told in a Pithy and Pointed Way.

A rumor that the Molson and Union banks are to be merged is denied.
 Philip Goddard, aged fifty-two years, a market gardener of Dixie, died from arsenical poisoning.
 The U.S. State Department has approved loans to China. It is said \$50,000,000 will be advanced.
 The first instalment of Toronto's taxes for 1918 amounted to fifty-nine per cent. of the total, breaking all records.
 Ashton Van Volkenburg of Hamilton, employed in a munitions plant at St. Catharines, was fined \$100 for sedition utterances.
 Lightning severely burned Sgt. C. E. Bradley, of Toronto, and played numerous freakish pranks at the home of Mrs. C. Brown in Pickering township.
 Oxford County Council, having become satisfied concerning the Y. M. C. A. war work overseas, has decided to pay the \$18,000 grant immediately.
 Hostilities have broken out between Bulgarian and Turkish troops along the Dedegatch-Adrianople railway. Turks are claiming this railway and both towns.
 Hon. Henry Aylmer, sheriff of St. Francis district, Sherbrooke, died Sunday in his seventy-fourth year. He was the second son of the late Lord Aylmer.
 Dr. John T. Gilmour, for many years warden of Toronto Central Prison and lately inspector of parole prisoners in Ontario, died suddenly on Monday.
 Rev. James Walter Hodgins, Stratford, in the Anglican ministry since 1883 and active in four fraternal societies, died at the age of sixty-three years.
 A syndicate headed by R. C. Matthews & Co., Toronto, were the successful tenderers for the new \$1,000,000 six per cent. ten year bonds of the Manitoba Government.
 Mrs. Harry Bursey, aged 60, was killed and Mrs. Morris probably fatally injured when an auto truck ran them down on Clair avenue, near Dufferin street, Toronto.
 The sombrero type of hat which American soldiers in England have chiefly worn is to be abandoned and the "overseas cap" similar to that worn by British aviators is to be adopted.
 A reduction in the weekly meat ration in Germany from 250 to 200 grammes is reported by the Vossische Zeitung of Berlin. The new ration came into force on August 12th.
 A sensation has been caused at Kiev through an order issued by the Ukrainian Government for the arrest of former War Minister Peshura and former Minister of Commerce Porach. The partisans of the ministers are charged with revolutionary machinations.
 R. J. Reynolds, Winston-Salem, N.C., head of one of the largest tobacco manufacturing concerns in the country, died on Monday. Mr. Reynolds, who was sixty-eight years old, had been ill for a year. His estate is estimated at more than \$10,000,000.
 There are now 318 fully-equipped shippings in the United States, and forty-four others partly complete, of which twenty-three are more than seventy-five per cent. finished, and only six less than twenty-five per cent. ready to begin building tonnage.
