

THE SINN FEIN CRIMINAL LUN-ACY IS DISASTROUS.

Older Priests in Ireland Waking Up to Seriousness of Conditions Created by Rebels.

Dublin, July 30 .- Some of the older Irish priests, particularly in County Wexford, have been speaking out strongly against the Sinn Feiners. Very Rev. Canon Walsh, presiding at a meeting of the Crossabeg and Ballymurn branch of the United Irish League, said the prospect before Ireland was a gloomy one, as the "criminal lunacy of Sinn Fein" was turning all Ireland's friends against her.

By insulting and trampling on the American flag and cheering for Emperor William, he said: "The unruly Sinn Fein faction" was turning the French republic, the American nation, and the English democracy into bitter enemies of Ire-


