BLIGHT OF GAS IS ON CIERGES VILLAGE Occupied Only by Dead Animals and Blasted Vegetation.

London, Aug. 6.—The tide of battle on the American front drifted somewhat eastward on Wednesday, all the most severe fighting occurring in the vicinity of the village of Cierges, which is some two miles south-east of Serzy, says Reuters' correspondent on the American front, telegraphing Thursday evening.

"Cierges" continues the correspondent, "has for some days been a stumbling block to our advance, and it is noteworthy that the Meunier wood formed strong centre of opposition during the first German retreat from the Marne, the havoc wrought during the two retreats being curiously intermingled. One stately chateau, whose towers have been freshly damaged by German shells, has in the banqueting hall big bushes of elderberries which evidently had seeded there when the roof was blown off in 1914.

"Cierges itself is unoccupied by either side, neither having any wish to be in there. For the village is in a deep cleft in which the gas lies ten feet deep. So it remains, and so it will remain while the still summer weather lasts, a village of the dead, of dead cats, rats and mice, with all the herbs and flowers that had blessed it burn and blighted.

"Meanwhile the battle circles about it on the surrounding hills, the Americans fighting towards it up the Ourcq valley and over the high ground north of Ronchères, and down from the hills near Serzy, while the Germans, after filling the village with gas, illustrated the tactics of the north and the east what could be accomplished in a deterring way with machine-gun fire."

"WE WIN," SAYS PAU. Pays Generous Tribute to Fighting Forces of Allies.

New York, Aug. 6.—General Pau, the one-armed hero veteran of the Franco-Prussian war of 1870-71, and the gallant commander of the French forces which protected the retreat of the Belgian army at Antwerp in the early days of the present struggle, and who reached New York Sunday evening with the members of the Franco-British war veterans' committee, said today: "When do you look for the war to end?" was the inevitable question. "The one remaining hand was thrown up. 'I know not,' he replied, 'but—and a grim smile played about the veteran's lips—'we win, this time.'"

"What do you say concerning the Canadians, General?" he was asked. "The ever-moving hand now smote his chest. 'The Canadians—comrades—gallant fighters—gentlemen! What more can be said? The soldiers of France are proud to be associated with them.'"

As to the military significance of the present situation General Pau naturally declined to comment. "I repeat," he said, "be the struggle long or short, we—France, Britain, America, Canada, Italy—the allies—we win, this time."

Gen. Pau intimated that he would possibly visit Canada before he returned to France.

On July 23rd, Mrs. Henry Kirkpatrick, Norwood, succumbed to an infirmity occasioned by a fall, and from which she had been suffering for the past two months. Her age was eighty-seven years. She was born at Black Creek, Prince Edward county, but for fifty years lived at Norwood. Her maiden name was Eliza Adams Minkler, the eldest of a family of eleven. Of these seven survive, including Mrs. Mary Rose and Charles Minkler, Picton.
