

THE TUSSOCK MOTH PERIL NOT SERIOUS PERIL

Queen's University Botanist Does Not Fear Depredations of the Moth.

Speaking with the Whig, Prof. W. T. MacClement, head of the botanical department at Queen's University, stated that he had been assured by the Government authorities that they did not anticipate any serious damage, from the tussock moth. The caterpillars at the present time are defoliating the trees in some places, but the moths will be so late in hatching out that the injury to the foliage by them is expected to be slight.

The eggs are also being destroy ed by parasites and comparatively few are expected to develop. Prof W. T. MacClement said that it was not because of any virtue on the part of the tussock moth that might not expect depredations, but because of the voracity of para-
