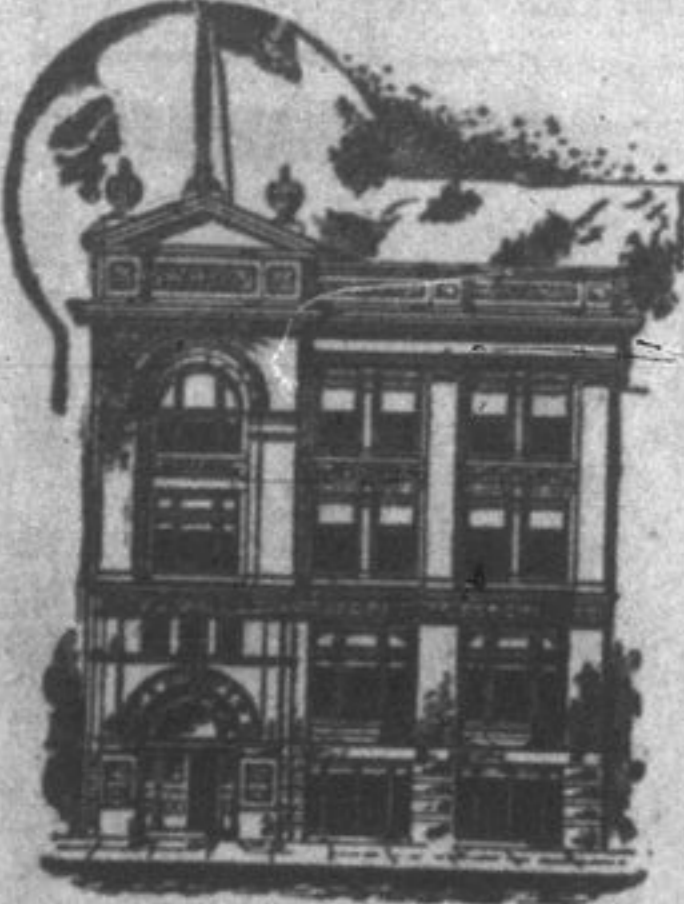


THE BRITISH WHIG 85TH YEAR.
