Aug. 12.—Cutting grain is the order of the day. Ross Wartman's barn was struck by lightning Thursday night, but no serious damage was done.

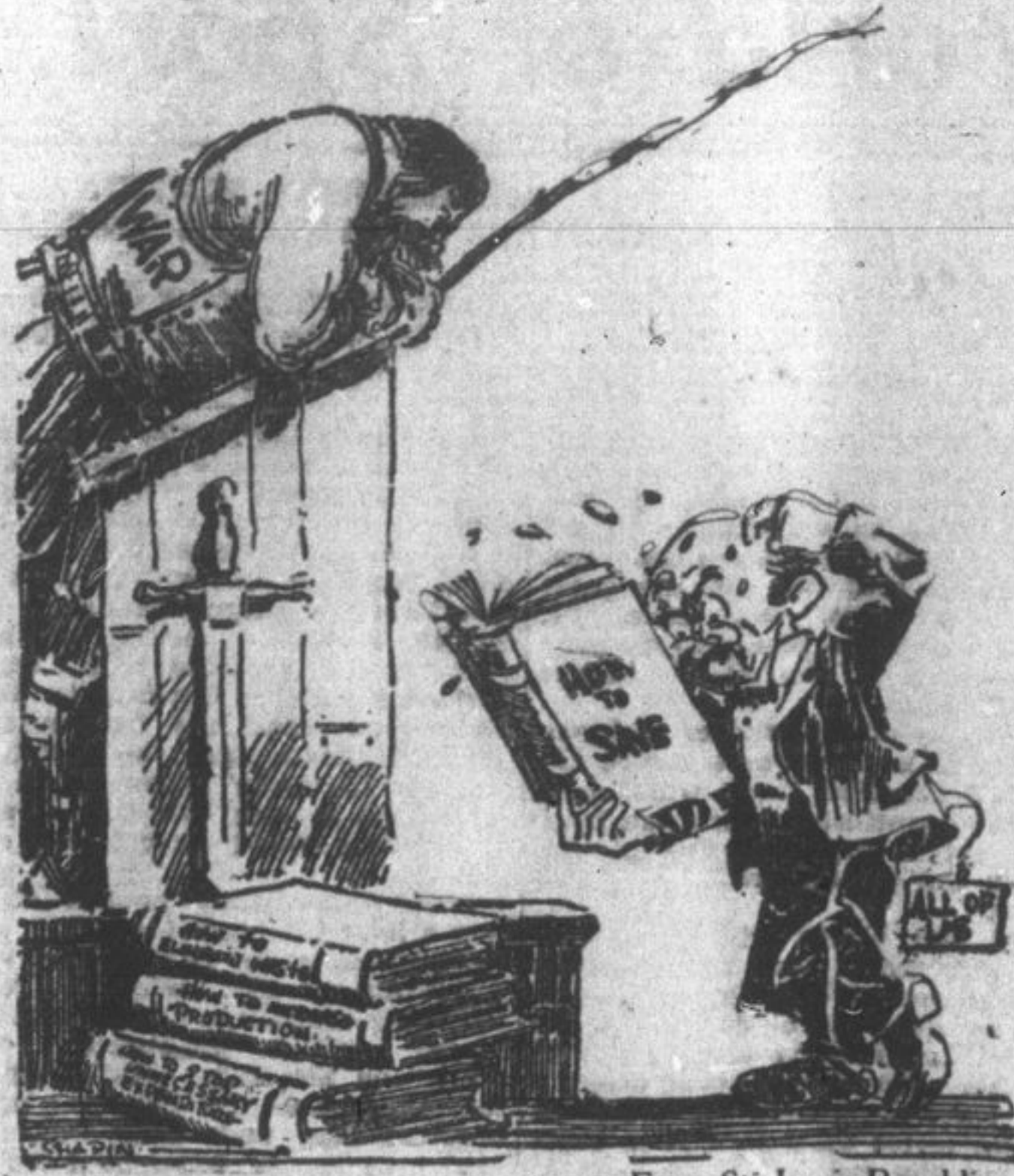
