The opinion prevailed that the present struggle around Roye and Lassigny would soon terminate i the capture of those points, to be followed by the taking of Noyon. The officers agree with the commentators abroad that all signs indicate that the enemy intends to withdraw and is fighting fierce rear guard actions only to cover his re tirement and to permit him to prepare strong lines in his rear which to stand fast.
