MANITOBA WHEAT YIELD.

Is Estimated at Close to Fifty Million Winnipeg, Aug. 17.-Manitoba will produce 47,124,000 bushels of wheat this year on a conservative estimate, according to J. A. Bowman, superintendent of immigration and coloniza-

tion for the province. In an interview to-day he said that the average yield would be eighteen bushels per acre at least. The totalacreage is 2,618,000 and on the eighteen bushels' estimate the result is as stated. It will probably come close to a 50,000,000 total, as Mr. Bowman says that eighteen bushels per acre is the lowest yield in hight.
