That baseball is a fit preparation for one branch of the military service was shown recently when Gordon Sarre, an American member of the Foreign Legion, established a new world's record at Fontainebleau for throwing the hand-grenade. Sarre threw the death-dealing grenade a distance of 70 meters and 50 centimeters, or nearly 215 feet. A few years ago Sarre was a ball player on one of the best known preparatory school teams in the United States.

The former record of 66 meters and 67 centimeters, made on the Fourth of July, is also held by a former baseball player named Shockers.
