

Should the Sox and Cubs come together in the annual fall classic, and it is likely that they will, it will be the first time in the nistory of the game that Boston and Chicago, the leaders in the world's series affairs, have come together The Boston fans have had several opportunities to see the champions of the National and American League clash for the highest hon-ors in baseball, as Boston has been a contender in 1903, 1912, 1914, 1915 and 1916. The Red Sox have taken part in each classic with the exception of the year 1914, and the Braves were the contending team

The fans in the Windy City have witnessed the champions of 1906. 1907 world's championship. The Cubs were the contenders in 1906, while the White Sox were the Chicago entrants in 1917. In 1906 the Cubs and White Sox each won the championship of their league, and 1907 and 1908, and again in 1910, the Windy City fans had an opportunity to witness each game in the
