GANANOQUE

(From Our Own Correspondent.)
Sept. 11.—A special meeting of the Town Council and Board of Trade was held on Monday evening. The business of the evening was along the line of good roads, concerning which Gananoque has a very just cause of complaint, as the local Board of Trade was the prime mover in starting the campaign for getting the Government to take over the construction and upkeep of a highway from Windsor to Montreal. Other sections of the roadway have been taken over, but as yet nothing is doing in this locality. President F. W. Bell, of the Board of Trade; ex-presidents Frederick J. Skinner and Alf. W. Taylor, Mayor Wilson, L. E. Barr and Joseph Dempster were appointed as a delegation to attend the meeting in Ottawa to-day, at which Premier Hurst and Mr. McDiarmid, Minister of Highways, will be the chief speakers, to urge on the Government the taking over of that part of the highway from the township of Pittsburg township to Prescott.

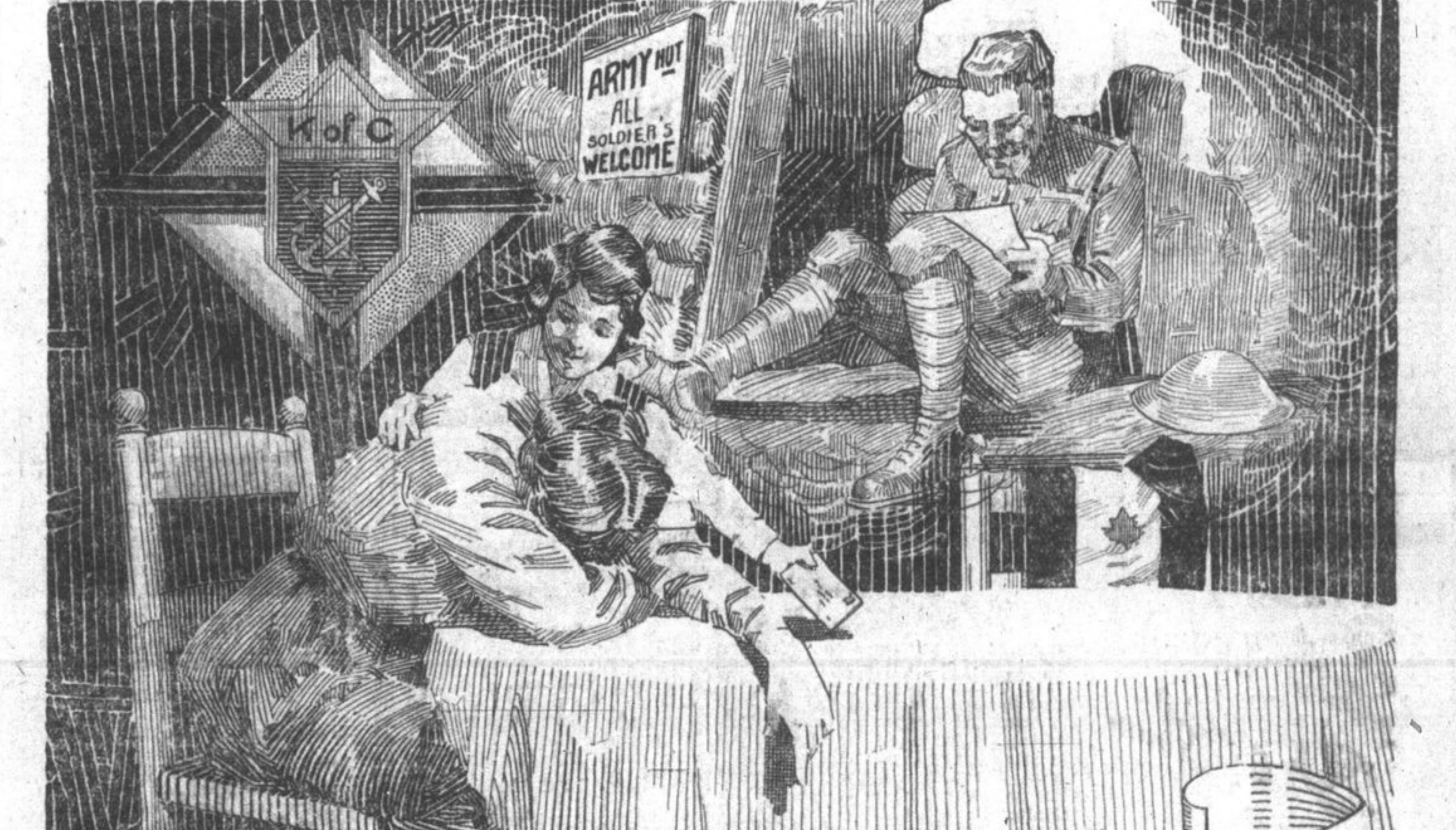
Rev. C. J. Curtis received word on Saturday that his son has been killed in action in France.
