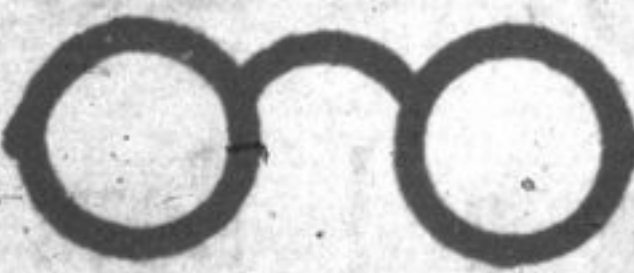

Liquor to Go to Charitable Institutions—Many Citizens Favor Appointment of Fuel Controller. Citizens generally are well pleased with the action of the Ontario License Board, in allowing the liquor confiscated by the police and license inspector to be distributed among charitable institutions. And it is certainly a good move too.

According to the gossip on the street, the majority of citizens believe that the city should have a fuel controller, and the action of the Civic Finance Committee, which now has the matter in hand, will be awaited with interest.
