Yery Little Graft. In referring to his inspection of the pay office, Bishop Fallon said that he was ashamed to refer to the 721/2 per cent, given to the soldiers as wages, After taking out expenditures for food and equipment there was a little figure, about the size of a peanut, and it was labelled "graft."
