Movements of Vessels Reported Along the Waterfront.

The schooner St. Louis arrived from Oswego with coal for Robert Crawford. The steamer Chamberlain cleared to-day for Charlotte. The steamer McLeod cleared for the Welland Canal after undergoing repairs. M.T. Co's.
