The terms "just and reasonable" may be deemed elastic, and in practice are constantly so found, but the committee is to determine the application and limit of the words. And to give force and effect to the prices fixed by the municipal authority, penalties up to \$1,000 or imprisonment for two years or both, are provided for contraven-
