PROFIT AND PRICE FIXING

PLACE THE RESPONSIBILITY UPON MUNICIPALITIES.

Of Protecting the Public Against Undue Profiteering.—Up to the Municipal Authorities to Act.

The cost of commodities and the price to the consumer are inter-related, but by no means one and the same thing. The profit of middlemen intervenes to determine the difference. In the article of wheat and its product flour, the Government has fixed both cost to miller and sale price for the latter. The miller is to pay about \$2.25 per bushel for wheat, and is to sell his flour to the distributor at an advance of not more than 25 cents a barrel over cost. In the case of cheese, a price of 23½ cents per pound paid during the summer has now been advanced to 25 cents per pound, and the whole output of creamery butter is to be taken by the Government until November 9th, at 46½ cents per pound. These articles are in a measure controlled at what is termed a fair and reasonable price for use of overseas troops and civilians whose home production falls far short of requirement. Now, any one of these articles serves to illustrate what appears to be proper action by those having authority to fix the price being fixed, this becomes the price to the consumer plus the expense and profit of the middlemen or distributors. Butter, for which the creamery will receive 46½ cents, will pass through the hands of wholesaler and retailer, who each will add to his cost expenses and profit in determining his selling price to the consumer. Obviously butter should not cost Canadian users more than the creamery price, which is the export price plus this spread, and if by reason of the withdrawal of the creamery make from the Canadian market for a period of six weeks, the price in Canada is marked up greatly, there will be something wrong with the price controlling or profit fixing machinery.

The Food Controller can do much, but he cannot do everything; and hence it is the municipalities, the local authorities, are given certain plenary powers, and invited to co-operate in controlling the high cost of living. The new regulations are important, and can be made practical by the municipal authorities exercise the power given them, and do not ignore their duty because it may be distasteful or give offence in some quarters. The council of each municipality is authorized to appoint a committee of two or more of its members to be known as the Fair Price Committee, and this committee will be empowered by the Minister of Labor to investigate.

The amount of any necessary of life held for sale in the municipality at any time; the time when required, the cost in the municipality of such necessary of life including all charges, the price at which the necessary is held for sale; the sale price which in the opinion of the committee would be a just and reasonable one; amount of wastage or destruction and the reason for same; fair rental of any dwelling held or offered for rental within the municipality.

When the investigation is completed the findings are to be reported to the Minister of Labor, and there is to be published in the newspapers the fair price to consumers in the municipality of the necessities of life investigated. "Every person," reads a new general clause, "who holds or offers for sale, or sells or provides or furnishes for consumption at a price, whether upon the premises which he occupies or not, any necessary of life, shall sell it, or provide or furnish the same for consumption at a price not higher than is just and reasonable, and any person who leases or holds or offers for rental any property shall lease the same at a rental not higher than is reasonable and fair under the terms 'just and reasonable' may be deemed elastic, and in practice are constantly so found, but the committee is to determine the application and limit of the words. And to give force and effect to the prices fixed by the municipal authority, penalties up to \$1,000 or imprisonment for two years, or both, are provided for contravention of the regulations.

The control of prices is thus localized. The responsibility of protecting the public against undue profiteering is placed upon municipal authorities. They cannot, indeed, reduce the base cost to the producer, but they can interpose against an excessive profit by middlemen at the expense of the consumer; and they can do so in a practical way. It is now up to the municipal authorities to act.

Government Lines Extend Train Service.

Mount Royal Tunnel, Montreal, has been opened for services by the Canadian Northern Railway, and on October 21st, through train service will be established between Toronto, Union Station, Ottawa Central Station and Montreal Tunnel Terminal, 415 LaSalle Street, W., two blocks from the Windsor Hotel, Windsor and Bonaventure Stations.

To Erect Gas Holder.

Davis & Farnham, the Boston steel contractors, awarded the contract for the erection of the new gas holder, are expected in the city in the course of a few days to begin the execution of their contract. Their tools have arrived and the material is already on hand so that the work is expected to proceed without interruption. The work of laying the conducting pipes from the generator to the new holder is well under way.

Princess Street Dismal.

Princess street presented a dismal appearance on Thursday evening. With a wind whistling down the street at a rate of forty miles an hour, scouring the roadway of its dust, and with all the theatres closed, citizens found little to attract them to the main street during the evening. The stores had few customers and the chill wind was most unpleasant. Everyone seemed depressed by the prevalence of the influenza.

IN MARINE CIRCLES.

Movements of Vessels Reported Along the Water Front.

The steamer Jex cleared on Friday for Oswego.

M.T. Co's. Bulletin—The tug Laura Grace arrived with the barge Lapwing and Edwards from Oswego; the Laura Grace cleared with the barge Brookdale for Oswego; the tug Whalen arrived with the barge Davie and Bacon with grain from Port Colborne; the tug Whalen cleared with the barge Dunmore and Winnipeg to load grain at Port Colborne; the tug Weaver will clear with two coal barges for Oswego; the tug Cedars; the steamer Simia and India, coal laden, are waiting until the Soulages canal opens.

The barge Idlewild and Louisa, which passed this port a month ago on their way to Corbyville, with a cargo of more than a million gallons of molasses, has cleared for New York. While on the way across the lake in tow of a tug the barge Idlewild, which was carrying the biggest load, broke away from her consort and was picked up during the night by a tug, which towed it into Kingston and then demanded salvage. The matter was taken to the courts. The boat is under bond.

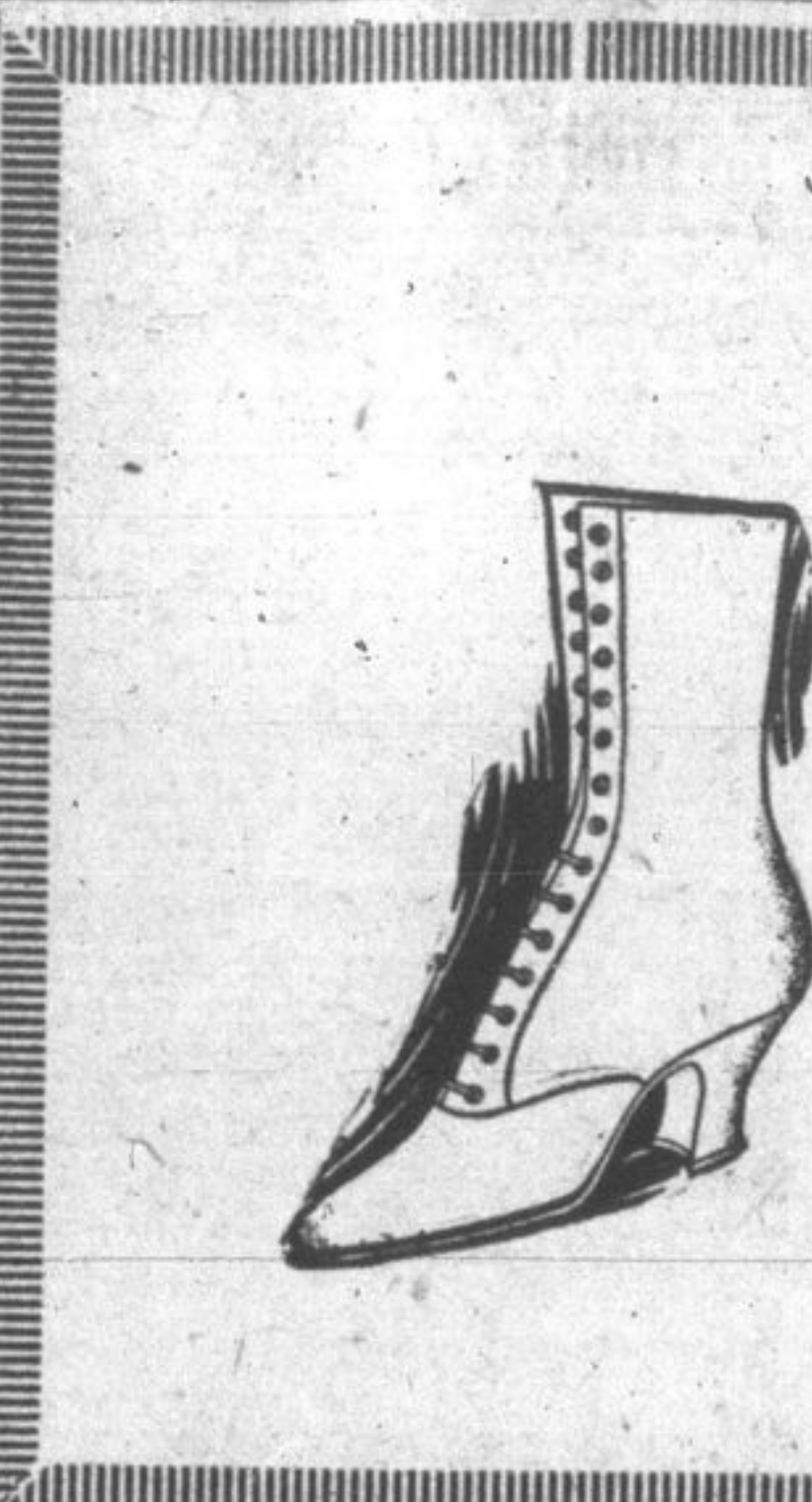
