READY FOR VICTORY LOAN

CITY AND COUNTY CANVASSERS ARE VERY ENTHUSIASTIC.

Stimulating addresses were delivered to the Workers at Luncheon held on Saturday—Drive will start in the City and County on Monday next.

Following the luncheon held at the Frontenac Club on Saturday the members of the local executive for the Victory Loan conferred with the city and county canvassers, who will start out on their work next Monday, Oct. 21st.

Addresses were given by Senator H. W. Richardson, W. F. Nickle, M.P.; Warden Reid, E. R. Thompson, of Toronto, organizer for the eastern division; G. R. Warburton, the local organizer; Dr. W. W. Sands and G. Y. Mills.

Both the city and county men have entered the new loan with the right spirit, and when the campaign opens with a bang, and it will be a loud one, too, on Monday next, the city and county will receive the greatest stirring it has had in some time, in spite of the many appeals which have already been made to help close the war.

The drive will be complete in every respect. Every person will have an opportunity of giving. The final arrangements are being made, and citizens of Kingston and the county should be ready when the canvassers call on them for their contribution.

Check Materials Favored for Youthful Frocks.

checks among the new materials to be used in the development of youth- ful dresses. The model pictured here is in cotton voile, trimmed with white. The distinctive features of the design are impressive, large shaped pockets at either side of the front, cut, cuffs and string belt of white tab satin, the collar and cuffs hemmed with dark braid for protection.

To develop the model in medium size requires 4 1/2 yards 36-inch voile, with 5/8 yard 36-inch satin for the trimming.

The sections made of contrasting material are laid on the goods just as shown in the cutting guide. Before cutting, however, fold the voile in half. Place the side front and side back on the material with large "D" perforations resting on a length- wise thread. The cut, sleeves and pocket also have the large "D" per- forations resting on the lengthwise threads. The straight edge of the neck is laid along the selvage of the voile. Lay the collar with the "T" perforation along the lengthwise fold of voile.

Now, take the remaining material and fold the sides over so that the selvages will rest in the center of the material as shown in the guide. The back rest on the folds with the triple "T" perforations along the lengthwise fold, while the front has the large "D" perforations on a lengthwise thread.

The side front and side back are laid in plaits and the waist is crossed in back and tied in front.
