Aside altogether from the element of patriotism involved in the purchase of the next Victory Loan, its potentiality as an investment security is of outstanding importance. This is particularly true of the fifteen-year maturity. Not only is the 5 1-2 per cent. rate of interest which it yields much higher than it was possible for an investor in the securities of any stable government to obtain in pre-war days, but the Victory Loan is gilt-edged in the fullest sense of the term. True, there has been a substantial increase in the public debt of the country during the past four years, but, on the other hand, there has been even a greater increase in the annual productive value of the Dominion.
