FOCH'S TERMS REACH BERLIN

Prepare For Victory Loan—The Allies Will Demand Complete and Unconditional Surrender of Turkey.

ALLIES MUST BE LANDED ON TURKISH SOIL BY ENTRY INTO DARDANELLES.

Turkey Must Also Deliver Up For Trial Certain Persons Accused of Disregarding Rules of Civilized Warfare.

(Canadian Press Despatch) London, Oct. 31.—A note from Turkey asking for peace is expected momentarily by the Allied Governments.

Foch's Terms Read Berlin. London, Oct. 31.—Marshal Foch's armistice terms arrived in Berlin Tuesday night.

Freedom of the Seas Much Questioned. What Does Wilson Mean By It?—Of Importance to Great Britain.

London, Oct. 31.—The general nature of the military guarantees which the Allies will require has been outlined as the occupation of strategic German bases, as well as the retirement of the German army to its own soil.

Berlin-Vienna Railway Is Cut

(Canadian Press Despatch) Paris, Oct. 31.—Communication between Agram and Plume, and Budapest and Vienna has been totally interrupted.

Plume is the principal seaport of Hungary. Agram is the capital of Croatia and Slavonia, is situated near the Save river, seventy-five miles inland.

Crisis For Austria Close at Hand

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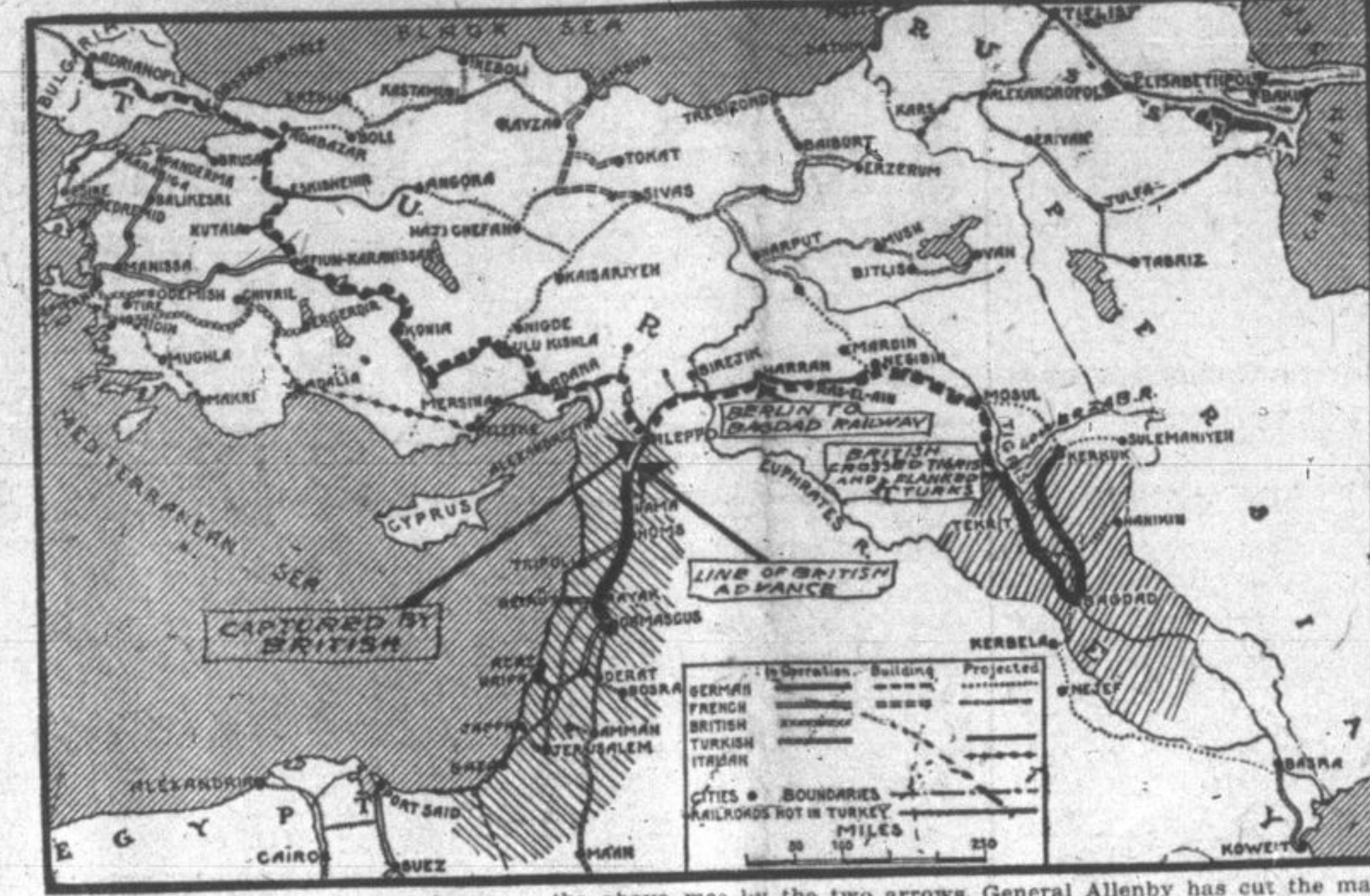

ATTACK WILSON'S PEACE PARLEYS TO GREAT BRITAIN

ISSUE JOINT MANIFESTO FOR THE ELECTION OF A REPUBLICAN CONGRESS.

Two Ex-Presidents Say It Is One-Man Control the Allies Are Fighting and They Want the People to Decide Terms.

(Canadian Press Despatch) New York, Oct. 31.—Theodore Roosevelt and William H. Taft issued here today a joint appeal for the election of a Republican majority in Congress.

"Terms of peace should be settled not by one man only. It is one-man control we are fighting in this war to suppress. If the peace treaty is to be useful in the future, it must be approved by the great body of the American people.

Serbian Cavalry Reach the Danube

(Canadian Press Despatch) Salonika, Oct. 31.—Serbian cavalry have reached the Danube, twenty-four miles southeast of Belgrade.

Paris, Oct. 31.—A despatch from Athens says the sole remaining Turkish army has been concentrated at Bulair on the neck of the Gallipoli peninsula.

GERMAN EMPRESS HAUNTED And Insists Upon the Abdication of the Kaiser.

(Canadian Press Despatch) Paris, Oct. 31.—The German Empress is very ill and weak, according to a Berne despatch to-day to the Petit Journal.

Says Kaiser Will Abdicate. Basel, Oct. 31.—Deputy Richard Kalkhoff declared at a recent meeting of the Communist party that he was able to affirm that Emperor William would not cling to the crown, but would abdicate for Germany's good.

Gets Five-year Term. Chatham, Oct. 31.—Five years in penitentiary was the sentence imposed on James Steadman, Tilbury, by Justice Masten, who tried him on two serious charges preferred by the parents of an eleven-year-old Tilbury girl.

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ITALIANS TAKE HUNDRED TOWNS

And Are Pressing Forward From the Grappa Region to the Sea.

(Canadian Press Despatch) London, Oct. 31.—The Italians have extended their offensive southward to the Adriatic, increasing the width of their drive to a front of more than 100 kilometres (62 miles).

The Austrians have reached the Livenza river, twelve miles east of the Piave. Vittorio, the great Austrian base, is situated on the west bank.

Austrians Flee in Disorder. Washington, Oct. 31.—Results of the victorious advance against the Austrians on the Italian front hourly increase in importance, says an official despatch to the Italian Embassy from Rome.

The Austrians are pressing closely on the heels of the enemy, the message states, having reached yesterday the River Livenza, where the Austrians attempted to stand to save their principal lines of retreat.

The Austrian army corps on the left wing has retreated in disorder, leaving behind war material and several hundred guns.

Further Advances. (Canadian Press Despatch) London, Oct. 31.—British forces fighting east of the Piave have reached the Livenza river at Francovista and the Italians have occupied Oderzo.

Austrians to Withdraw. Vienna, Oct. 31.—Austrian troops fighting on Italian soil will be withdrawn, according to an official statement issued by the War Office.

Whole Front Ablaze. (Canadian Press Despatch) London, Oct. 31.—The entire Italian front is ablaze. The Central News despatch from Rome says all the Italian armies now are in action.

A Vienna despatch says—Austro-Hungarian forces on their eastern wing in Serbia are withdrawing from occupied territory and have completed the crossing of the Danube. Elsewhere in Serbia the Austrian withdrawal continues.

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
