OWING TO EPIDEMIC And Not Because the End of the War May Be

EXTENSIONS GRANTED

The granting of an extension of farm leave from November 1st until November 15th, and the cancelling of orders for draftees to report has led to rumors that this is being done because the end of the war is immini-Orders have been issued from Ottawa instructing deputy registrars to mail to draftees cancellations of their calls to report. It is specifically stated that this cancellation i for medical reasons, on the ground that this would assist in combatting Spanish influenza. So far as Military District No. 3 is concerned, these orders have been anticipated, the Deputy Registrar, Major Cook, having, already cancelled all calling-up notices until the epidemic has abated. This step was taken solely on account of the influenza. The authorities are working ahead on the assumption that there is still a long war shead, and are not letting up in
