FRENCH STUDENT-TEACHER INCIDENTS OF THE DAY

ARRIVES FROM FRANCE TO ASSIST QUEEN'S GIRL STUDENTS.

Her Arrival Inaugurates a Movement in Canada to Build up a Closer Understanding Between France and America.

An interesting experiment has recently been made in the matter of building up a closer understanding, an entente cordiale between France and America.

A movement, set on foot by one of the American women's colleges, and heartily supported by the French Government, is seeking to combat this ignorance and prejudice by bringing a number of French student-teachers into American academic life.

The first such student-teacher to arrive in Canada in Miss Haynaud, who has just taken up her duties at the women's residence at Queen's University on the initiative of Prof. R. K. Rickles, late acting head of the French department.

No report of the work done by the devoted V.A.D.'s will be complete which failed to pay tribute to the untiring and inspiring leadership of Mayor Hughes, and of W. F. Nickle, M.P. for Kingston, and the devoted indefatigable work of the lady superintendent Mrs. G. Hunter Ogilvie, and her honorary secretary, Miss Ida C. Roman, and Miss Dorothy Goodwin, who spared themselves in nothing to minister to the wants of suffering humanity.

EXTENSIONS GRANTED OWING TO EPIDEMIC

And Not Because the End of the War May Be Near.

The granting of an extension of farm leave from November 1st until November 15th, and the cancelling of orders for draftees to report has led to rumors that this is being done because the end of the war is imminent. Orders have been issued from Ottawa instructing deputy registrars to mail to draftees cancellations of their calls to report. It is specifically stated that this cancellation is for medical reasons, on the ground that this would assist in combating Spanish influenza. So far as Military District No. 3 is concerned, these orders have been anticipated, the Deputy Registrar, Major Cook, having already cancelled all calling-up notices until the epidemic has abated. This step was taken solely on account of the influenza. The authorities are working ahead on the assumption that there is still a long war ahead, and are not letting up in any way with their preparations.

Yorker-Colebrooke Red Cross.

At the fourth annual meeting of the Yorker-Colebrooke Red Cross, held on Oct. 16th, all the officers were re-elected unanimously: President, Mrs. N. Boyce; vice-president, Mrs. A. Huffman; secretary, Mrs. A. W. Benjamin; treasurer, J. McElmott; convener of cutting committee, Mrs. G. Lee; convener of sewing committee, Mrs. J. Wright; convener of wool committee, Mrs. A. A. Connolly; convener of packing committee, Mrs. J. Freeman.

The receipts for the year were \$2,288; expenditures, \$2,254. Ten shipments were made to headquarters in Toronto containing 1,292 suits pyjamas, 1,945 pairs socks, 48 trench caps, 71 stretcher caps, 54 hot water bottle covers, etc.
