Kaiser Abdicates--Germany Quits

It's Over--Over There

The Huns Routed and Driven Out of France by the Allied Armies Under Foch
 ---The German Empire Broken Up Through Revolution---The Once
 Mighty Fatherland Perishes by the Sword It Unsheathed.

GERMANY NO LONGER HAS AN EMPEROR

The Kaiser And the Crown Prince Renounce the Throne And Say Good-Bye to the German Army--Socialist Leader Is Appointed Chancellor.

(Canadian Press Despatch.)
 London, Nov. 11.—The Kaiser of Germany and the Crown Prince have abdicated. On Saturday afternoon this wireless message was received from Berlin:

"The German Imperial Chancellor, Prince Maximilian of Baden, has issued the following decree:

"The Kaiser and King has decided to renounce the throne. The Imperial Chancellor will remain in office until questions of the abdication of the Kaiser, renouncing by the Crown Prince of the throne of the German

Empire and of Prussia, and setting up of a regency, have been settled. For the regency he intends to appoint Deputy Ebert as Imperial Chancellor, and he proposes that a bill shall be brought in for the establishment of a law providing for immediate promulgation of general suffrage and for constitutional German national assembly, and will settle finally the future form of government of the German nation and of those peoples desirous of coming within the Empire."

Ernest Augustus, reigning Duke of Brunswick and son-in-law of the Kaiser, has also abdicated. Several

Ebert Is Chancellor.

 Zurich, Switzerland, Nov. 11.—Because of troubles in the interior of Germany, Prince Maximilian of Baden and all bourgeois ministers have resigned, says a despatch from Berlin. Friedrich Ebert, German Socialist, has been definitely recognized as Chancellor.

Simply Couldn't Do It.

Kaiser Bids Army Good-bye.

 Amsterdam, Nov. 11.—The former Kaiser and Crown Prince took leave of the German army on Saturday morning, after signing the abdication, but nothing further is known of them.

Nearly all the kings and dukes of the German Empire have now abdicated. There is a general strike all over Germany and the situation is serious as the result of the stopping of food trains.

Disposal of Her Estate.

The balance of the estate, estimated at a total of \$70,000,000 to \$80,000,000 will go to Mrs. Sage's brother, Col. J. J. Slocum, it is believed.

BERLIN TAKEN BY THE "REDS"

The German Revolutionists Captured the Capital After Severe Fighting.

FRAU KRUPP UNDER ARREST

ESSEN IS IN THE HANDS OF THE REVOLUTIONISTS.

The Armistice Terms Will Deprive Germany of Military Power on Land and Sea and in the Air.

 Copenhagen, Nov. 11.—Berlin was occupied by forces of the soldiers and workmen's councils on Saturday afternoon.

It is officially announced from Berlin that the war ministry has placed itself at the disposal of Friedrich Ebert, Socialist leader, whose appointment as Imperial Chancellor was forecasted by decree of Prince Maximilian. and rich people. All national cockades and eagles are removed and replaced on the German soldiers' helmets by red bands. The wearing of iron crosses by German soldiers is prohibited by the new council.

The Kaiser Aimed To Teutonize World

Throughout his reign of a quarter of a century the Kaiser had but one ambition—to "Teutonize" the world. He subordinated everything else, or made everything else fit in with his ambition.

In 1871 Germany had no navy or merchant marine worthy the name. It was through the Kaiser's demands that both were raised to second place among the nations. It was the same with the German army. The vast German military machine was actually the child of the Kaiser's ambition.

Because he taught and practised the theory that only through military and naval supremacy could Germany arrive at "a place in the sun," the Kaiser became known as the "war lord." Although he forced out Bismarck, the "iron chancellor," the Emperor followed Bismarck's teachings that only by the "mild fist" could Germany live and grow.

His oft-repeated insistence that he ruled by divine right aided him in carrying out his policies. It tended to make his subjects, both high and low, more subservient to his de-

mands and whims. As the German Empire grew from a population of 47,000,000 to 67,000,000, and to a place in the commercial world surpassing in some lines even Great Britain, his influence and power increased.

The Kaiser was born Jan. 27th, 1857. In saving his mother's life when he was born the main nerves of his left arm were so strained that the arm became shrivelled, and has hung useless ever since. Since childhood he has had to use a specially-made fork with a heavy edge that served as a knife as well.

One reason for his well-known dislike for his mother, who was a daughter of Queen Victoria of England, was laid to the operation which resulted in the loss of the use of his arm.

Steel's Generous Gift.
 New York, Nov. 11.—The Steel Corporation's contribution of \$5,000,000 to the United War Work Fund is equal to nearly one per cent. on the common stock. In voting the gift, it is understood, the directors acted with full confidence that stockholders would approve the application of so substantial an amount of earnings to Americans in France and the home camps.
