PEACE!
Peace has come. In a little room one hundred miles behind the firing line somewhere in France, the representatives of a humbled and defeated Germany put their signatures to the agreement of final and complete surrender. The terms of General Foch have been accepted in full, and the arrogant Hun, after fifty months in which he disregarded all the rules of humanity and civilized warfare, has been forced to capitulate to the demands of the champions of freedom and justice. The world has at last been set free from the tyrant who desired to trample it under foot. Everywhere, all around the globe, except, perhaps, in the revolution-stirred German Empire, the news will be received with rejoicing and thanksgiving.

Whatever the exact terms of the armistice may be, one thing is certain. The enemy has surrendered unconditionally and has accepted the terms laid down by the Allied war council. It is certain that these terms are such that the Huns will never again be able to plunge the world into a terrible and destructive war. The Allies will demand such guarantees and such curtailment of the power of Germany that militarism will never again raise its head in that country, or in any other. The whole world knows that in the defeat of the Huns the last barrier to progress and democracy in the world has disappeared. Now it will be possible for the world to beat their swords into ploughshares and to lay aside their weapons of war, to turn their energies to rebuilding and re-establishing the people of the invaded and suffering countries in their old homes. What joy it will be to these refugees to know that they can now return home, triumphant in their victory over brute force, and knowing that the monster of Prussianism will never again sweep over their land.

The final victory has come, and it has been complete. It has been brought about by the scintillating courage of the French, the bulldog and determined perseverance of the British Empire, the patient struggles of the Serbians, the heroic fighting of the Italians, and the enthusiastic efforts of the United States. All have done their part in bringing about the victory, and all deserve equally the thanks of the whole world, and that includes the German people. To what a sad state that country has been reduced by its autocratic rulers. Torn by revolution, its rulers fleeing for their lives to Holland, the government in the hands of a socialist whose ideas savour of Bolshevism, the people of Germany are in a sad plight. The hand of God has fallen upon them, and retribution is nigh. Verily, the Allies might point the erring German people to the words, "Vengeance is Mine, I will repay, saith the Lord." The crimes of four years of war are being visited upon the people who ordered these crimes. What will result from the revolution is still doubtful. But the one great fact remains, and is being celebrated all over the civilized world to-day. The great German military machine has been completely smashed, the German leaders have surrendered completely, and France and Belgium have been freed from the enemy. Once more peace reigns all over the earth, and the fighting men can lay down their arms with the knowledge of a task well done. To our fighting men, those lads who have won for us this great and glorious victory, our thoughts fly at this time. The thanks of the world are theirs, for to them we owe the fact that we are to-day celebrating this 'historical event.' Let our minds then wander overseas in loving thanksgiving to our boys "over there," and then upwards in fervent thanksgiving to the Great God of Justice and righteousness who has been our shield and buckler through all the long years, and has crowned our arms with final victory.

Mons Taken By Canadians

London, Nov. 11.—To Canadian troops fell the honor of capturing the last important town before the armistice put an end to hostilities. **Mons**, where the British made a brilliant stand at the beginning of the war, was retaken early this morning by the Canadians.

CHARGED WITH TREASON.

Prominent German Socialist Leaders Are Arrested.

Amsterdam, Nov. 11.—The secretary of the independent social democratic party, Herr Barth, has been arrested, according to Berlin advices, and the Bureau is closed. The prominent socialist editor, Herr Daemig, was also arrested Saturday. The latter was charged with highly treasonable activity.

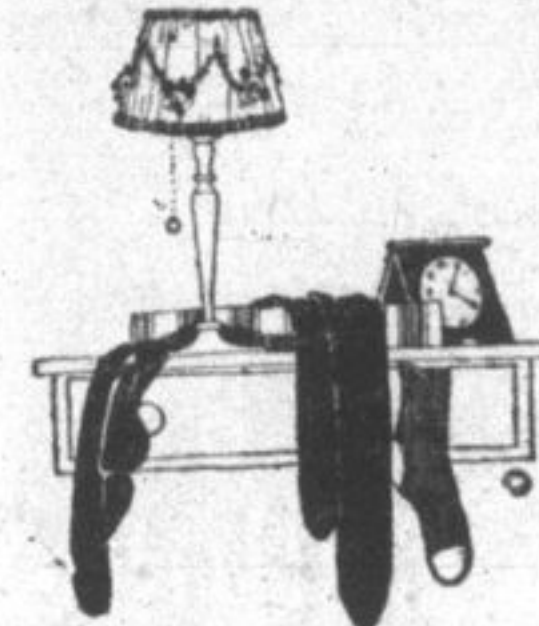
