CANADIAN HORSES IN WAR

MAJOR WALSH TOLD THE PART THEY PLAYED.

Address Was Given Under the Auspices of the Kingston Humane Society and Blue Cross Society—Fine Musical Programme Was Also Rendered.

An interesting story of the part the Canadian horses played in the war, was told in the City Hall on Tuesday evening by Major Walsh, who was connected with the veterinary corps. The address was given under the auspices of the Kingston Humane Society, and the Blue Cross Society, and in addition to the address, there was an excellent programme in which the Great War Veterans' band and local talent took part. Col. G. Hunter Ogilvie very ably filled the duties of chairman. The boy members of the Blue Cross Society, with the band, occupied seats on the platform. The society, under the leadership of Miss Goings, did much, during the course of the war, in a quiet way, to help the work of the veterinary corps by sending over bandages and other necessities, and Major Walsh returned thanks to Miss Goings and her band of young workers for the noble part they took to help along the work.

In his address, Major Walsh gave a resume of the movements of the Canadian horses from the time they left Canada until they reached the front. He told how the horses were treated for injuries and sickness and paid a warm tribute to the worth of the animals in the great conflict. He referred to the fact that some of the horses suffered from gas, and remarked that although an attempt had been made to get the horses to wear gas masks, the experiment was not a success. Some people, he said, had an idea that horses were not needed in view of the service rendered by automobiles, but he pointed out that the automobiles could only go so far, and then the horses had to be used in reaching the front line trenches.

The musical part of the programme provided a fine treat, and in addition to the band selections, which included patriotic and other airs, consisted of solos by Miss Craikshanks and Q.M.S. Gask; violin and piano selections by Masters Howard and Peter Fair, sons of ex-Ald. W. J. Fair, and a duet by Miss Phyllis Devlin and C. B. S. Harvey.

At the close of his address Major Walsh was tendered a hearty vote of thanks, on motion of ex-Ald. W. J. Fair, seconded by Miss A. M. Machar. The affair was brought to a close

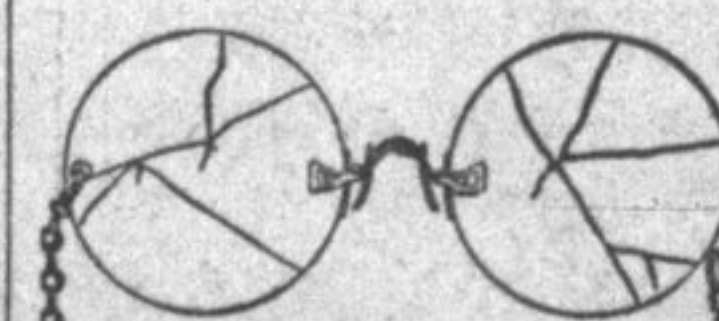
