ONLY BY CONSENT

Of Soldier Can His Physical Condition be Revealed. Information sought by insurance companies regarding the physical ondition of a soldier or ex-soldier can only be furnished by the Government when written consent of the man concerned is given, according to a recent decision, A fixed procedure for obtaining such information has been drawn up as fol-

(a) Applications regarding solliers in the service should be forwarded by the insurance company to the general officer commanding the district in which they are serving. (b) Applications regarding exsoldiers who have been discharged for reasons other than physical unfitness, should be forwarded by the insurance company to the director
