Letters to the Editor
Mrs. Wright's Statement.
Kingston, Dec. 24, 1918. (The Editor): In your issue of Dec. 21st misleading statement is credited to officers of the Local Council of Women, also a letter from Miss Mowat, published on Dec. 23rd, contains information not in accordance with facts.
Although not anxious to enter into any controversy in the public press regarding difficulties in the Local Council of Women, I have been requested by societies and persons interested to make known the withdrawal on Dec. 19th of the Women's Christian Temperance Union, Hotel Dieu Auxiliary, Jewish Society, Kingston Chapter Graduate Nurses, Orphans' Guild, Mothers' Council of Y. M. C. A., City Poor Relief Association, Nurses' Alumnae of Kingston General Hospital, Catholic Girls' Club, Victorian Order of Nurses, the elected conveners of the standing committees on child welfare, care of the mentally deficient, equal moral standard, household economics, nursing, laws for the better protection of women, or vice-president and the corresponding secretary.

The motion to accept these withdrawals and resignations was passed without discussion, being called for by the president; therefore the broad statement made by Miss Mowat that no difficulty or dissatisfaction existed cannot be sustained, when no discussion was permitted in the meeting; and the public press seems to be far from the proper place to open such discussion.
I am requested to state that the withdrawal of the I. O. D. E. had no bearing whatsoever upon the resignations in question, which are neither national nor international, but based entirely on local conditions.
Permit me to call your attention to the fact that none of the persons interested in these withdrawals were responsible for the article on the
