The International Sunday School Lesson for Dec. 29th is, "Faith Victories."—Heb. 11: 8-22.

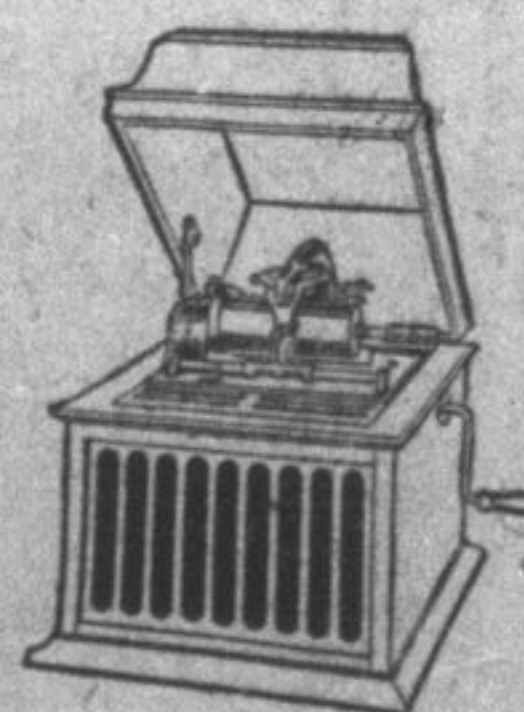
