The other is entitled "Canadians in the Great Advance," and shows scenes leading up to the final battle of the capture of Mons. After re-arrangement and consolidation into a two-reel feature the film will be ready shortly after the first of the year.

WHIG LETTER OF 1843

TOOK SIXTEEN DAYS TO GO TO SANDWICH, ONT.

The Original Returned to the Whig—It Was Among the Papers of the Late Charles Baby, M.P.P. J. J. Behan, secretary-treasurer of the C.M.B.A., has received a letter from W. J. McKee, Windsor, grand treasurer of the order, which will be of interest to Whig readers. Mr. McKee stated that the letter was found among the papers of his wife's father, the late Charles Baby, M.P.P., who was a leader of the French-Canadian families in Western Ontario. Mr. McKee is an ex-member of the Legislature where he was a Liberal whip for a number of years, and a warm personal friend of the late E. J. B. Pense. He sent the letter to Mr. Behan and Mr. Behan handed it to the Whig. The letter is as follows:

Kingston, Dec. 22, 1843
Dear Sir: Your letter of the 15th came to hand this morning, and, in Dr. Barker's absence, I hasten to give you the required information. Our subscription list at Sandwich consists of Col. Prince, Vice Gen. McDonald, yourself and a Mr. Duncan McKay of Detroit. This comprises the whole of the subscribers in your neighborhood and the paper is mailed regularly every Tuesday and Friday evening. (I make up the parcels myself.)

I have the honor to be, Sir, your obedient servant,
ROBERT R. SMILEY,
Printer British Whig,
Chas. Baby, Esq., Sandwich.
Letters were carried by stage in those days and there were no postage stamps or envelopes. The letter was simply folded and gummed with a wax wafer. It cost one shilling and four pence to send the letter to Sandwich and the post mark on the back is "Dec. 28th, 1843," showing that it took sixteen days to make the journey from Kingston.

SCHEDULE OF ALLOWANCES

UNDER ORDER-IN-COUNCIL RE WAR SERVICE GRATUITY

The Pay That Will Be Issued For Service Both in the Navy and On Land Overseas and in Canada.

The following is the schedule showing the number of days pay and allowances to which an ex-member of the Canadian Forces is entitled under Order-in-council No. 1165, P.C. 1165, "War Service Gratuity."

A—In the Canadian Naval Service for three years, six months of which service were in a sea-going ship, 182 days.

B—In the Canadian Naval Service for two years and under three years, six months of which service were in a sea-going ship, 153 days.

C—In the Canadian Naval Service for one year and under two years, six months of which service were in a sea-going ship, 122 days.

D—In the Canadian Naval Service for less than one year, six months of which service were in a sea-going ship, 92 days.

A—In the R.N.C.V.R. (Overseas Div.) in a ship of the Royal Navy for three years, 182 days.

B—In the R.N.C.V.R. (Overseas Div.) in a ship of the R.N. for two years and under three years, 153 days.

C—In the R.N.C.V.R. (Overseas Div.) in a ship of the R.N. for one year and under 2 years, 122 days.

D—In the R.N.C.V.R. (Overseas Div.) in a ship of the R.N. for less than one year, 92 days.

A—In the C.E.F. for three years, any part of which service was overseas, 182 days.

B—In the C.E.F. for two years and under three years, any part of which service was overseas, 153 days.

C—In the C.E.F. for one year and under two years, any part of which service was overseas, 122 days.

D—In the C.E.F. for less than one year, any part of which service was overseas, 92 days.

E—In any Canadian Naval or land force, for two years or over, 92 days.

F—In any Canadian Naval or land force for two years and under three 61 days.

G—In any Canadian Naval or land force, for one year and under two, 31 days.

Any previous post discharge pay paid to an applicant for this gratuity will be deducted from the amount to which he is entitled according to the above schedule.

Payments on this account shall be for a single man without dependents not less than \$70 for 31 days, and for a married man, or a man with dependents not less than \$100 per month.
