Alderman Newman was on the job night and day during the 'flu epidemic. This is the type of man we want for mayor. Vote for him.

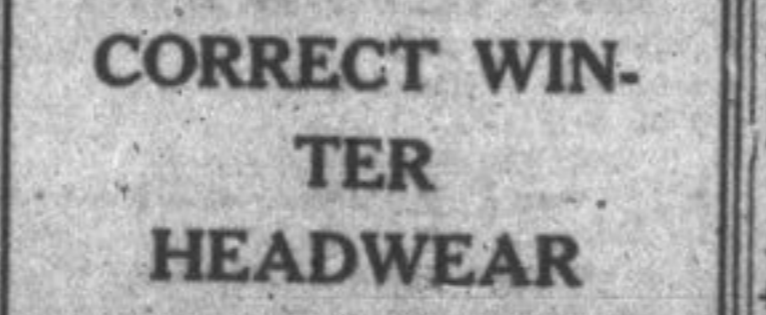
